Lions International Peace Poster Contest

2026-2027 Contest Materials will be available Jan. 15

For nearly four decades, the Lions International Peace Poster Contest has given children ages 11-13 the opportunity to share what peace means to them through art. Each year, Lions clubs around the world sponsor the contest in schools and organized youth groups, giving young people the opportunity to be recognized at local and international levels — and awarded a grand prize of US\$5,000 — for their creativity in sharing their vision of the current year's theme.

Diabetes Camp Scholarships

In the past 15 years District 17-A has sent 1 to 5 youth per year to one of two Diabetes Camps administered by the American Diabetes Association ADA.

The cost to a family to send a youth to a Diabetes camp has gone up over the years where now it cost a family \$825 for one camp and \$700 for the other. District 17-A has always asked the family to pay \$150 and the District would scholarship the rest.

The estimated cost for a family to support a youth with Diabetes is \$1,000 to \$2,000 per month. This is why District A has scholarshiped such a large amount. District 17- A has 5 youth that have asked for a scholarship this year 2026. Last October the District 17-A Lions Health Program LHP ask for donations to off set the scholarships. The District has received 1 donation for these scholarships of \$500. Please look at your funds and make a donation to the Diabetes Camp Fund, any amount is fine.

Please make the check to District 17-A Diabetes fund, and on the memo line write Diabetes Camp Fund and send the check to Lion Vern Failor, he collects this information and forwards the check to the District Treasurer.

Let's make 2026 a memorable year for the 5 families that have ask for a Diabetes Scholarship.

PDG Rich Webster Nominations Chair

It is time for nominations to be submitted.
Here's what you need to know!

Any qualified member of a club in the District seeking the office of District Governor shall file his or her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee prior to the day of its report to the convention, and furnish evidence of her or his compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the [District Constitution and By-Laws](#).

The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the District Convention the name(s) of all candidate(s) so qualified. If none is so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. Each candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration. **Any member of a club in the District seeking the office of First or Second Vice District Governor** shall file his or her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the election, and furnish evidence of her or his compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the District Constitution and By-Laws.

A candidate for **Director of any Lions Foundation recognized by MD-17** shall file her or his written letter of intent with a Nominating Committee member no less than thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Convention of the District. If no applications are received, the presiding officer shall call for nominations from the floor.

Voting Delegates are determined by the number of members in the individual club. Each voting delegate from a club and each Past District Governor must present a delegate form signed by the president or secretary of his or her club. The District Governor or First and Second Vice District Governors may sign the delegate form if the delegate has misplaced the original form. Each delegate must be a member in good

Pennies to Dollars, Regardless of the Amount, Can Change a Life Today

It may be easy to come to the conclusion that small donations to Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) do not have an impact. But that conclusion could not be further from the truth. Since 1968, LCIF has provided more than twenty thousand grants totaling over one billion dollars. These grants provided critical funds that empowered Lions to expand their service and strengthen our humanitarian mission across Lion's global causes. The generosity of LCIF's donors directly impact personal outcomes for individual beneficiaries. The power of LCIF can be measured by one; one life forever changed directly by the donations of each donor.

As LCIF donors, we have experienced firsthand the impact on individuals and communities right here in Kansas. Since 1980 to just last September, Kansas has received over 80 grants, totaling in excess of \$1.4 million dollars. From 2000 through 2025, Kansas has been the recipient of at least one grant per year, except in 2004, 2005, 2016, and 2023. A lookback to January 2025 and the California fires, emphasizes what our donations and those of Lions from around the world mean to one person or community impacted by a major disaster.

California, Jan. 15, 2025: As wildfires continued to sweep through the Los Angeles area, causing injuries, fatalities, and widespread destruction to homes and businesses, Lions in the region stepped up to assist those in need. With more than \$100,000 in Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) grant funding, they were able to expand their efforts to provide critical support and resources to affected communities. Funds were used to meet immediate needs, including emergency food packs, water bottles, power cords, hygiene kits, blankets and face masks, as well school supplies for children.
