

### **Cucumber Bruschetta**



2 Cucumbers, Seeded & Diced 1 Clove Garlic, Minced

3 Tablespoons Chopped Fresh Basil 2 Teaspoons Red Wine Vinegar

Salt & Pepper to Taste

1 Diced Tomato

1 Tablespoon Olive Oil

Add all topping ingredients in a bowl and gently toss to combine.

For Serving Need: 1 Baguette, Olive Oil, and 1 Clove Garlic Slice baguette into 3/4" slices and brush the top of each slice with olive oil. Broil 2-3 minutes or until lightly toasted. Remove from the oven. Rub each slice of bread with the fresh clove of garlic. Spoon the cucumber mixture over the bread to serve.

### **Montessori Co-op School Project**

On August 8th the Montessori Camp Co-op located on north 52nd street delivered food items to Project Hope. The students raised money at a student run carnival to

purchase the food items. The class took a school bus to the Baker's grocery store at 72nd & Ames and each student was given \$15 to shop for items needed at Project Hope. Baker's gave the student's a discount on their purchases.
