#### 6 Medium Russet Potatoes 4 Tablespoons Butter

3 Cups Whole Milk Salt and Pepper

- 1. Scrub, peel, and chop potatoes.
- 2. Place prepared potatoes in large soup pot and cover with water.
- 3. Cook potatoes over medium heat until fork tender, about 20 minutes. Remove from heat and drain.
- 4. Add milk and butter to the potatoes. Place back on medium heat and allow milk to bubble slightly around the edges of the soup pot, about 5 to 10 minutes.

Potato Soup

- 5. Remove from heat and ladle into soup bowls.
- 6. Serve with salt and pepper to taste.
