POTATO SALAD

5 or 6 medium potatoes peeled and cut into 3/4-inch chunks

1 cup mayonnaise 1 tsp. sugar

2 Tbsp. vinegar 1 1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. ground black pepper

1/2 cup chopped onion 1 cup thinly sliced celery

2 hard-cooked eggs, chopped (optional)

Cover potatoes with water in 4-quart saucepan; bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Reduce heat and simmer until potatoes are tender, about 10 minutes. Drain and cool slightly.

Combine mayonnaise, vinegar, sugar, salt, and pepper in large bowl. Add potatoes and remaining ingredients and toss gently.

Serve chilled or at room temperature. Tip: Make sure to toss potatoes with the dressing while they are still warm. That way they really soak up the flavor!
