#### **Executive Report**

Project Hope had a challenging and successful year in 2024. We successfully served 21% more households and individuals in the food pantry and 37% more households in the clothing pantry. Challenging because the cost of food continued to increase and even though individuals donated \$10,000 more than budgeted it was a 32% decrease from the previous year. Fortunately, the Food Bank for the Heartland provided 49% more food to us this year at no cost and organizations such as ReRuns donated large amounts of in-season clothing.

Our two satellite food pantry locations called One14 Center pantry at Lutheran Church of the Master and the Loaves & Fishes pantry at St. Matthew Lutheran Church continued to serve households in south central and southwest Omaha.

Project Hope successfully completed the last phase of our drive and parking lot in November of 2024. This was a five-year process of obtaining funding, approval of plans, and completion of work to provide a cement drive to the lower level and parking for our clients. We will no longer have client vehicles and grocery carts stuck in the mud.

Our Board of Directors made a bold decision to use our two sizable financial gifts to strengthen and stabilize our organization for the future. James P. & Patricia Duffy provided in their living trust a gift of over \$83,000 to Project Hope. The Board approved for \$45,000 to be placed in a new Facility Fund for future improvements and \$20,000 in a Capital Equipment Fund. The balance of this gift was used to obtain immediate facility, equipment, and food needs. The entire \$100,000 gift from the Lutheran Service Corp has been invested in our newly developed Endowment Fund called The Lutheran Service Corp Endowment to meet future needs. A new gift policy was also adopted by the Board of Directors.

We are blessed that our board members, employees and volunteers work together to feed and clothe God's people in need, providing nutritious food and clean gently used clothing to others with love, hope, compassion and dignity. With the generosity of our donors including individuals, church organizations, grant providers, and local businesses we were able to help our neighbors and improve their lives by spreading God's blessings. We appreciate our donors, volunteers, staff, board members, and organizational partners who make us successful in our mission.

#### **Client Services**

#### **Food Pantries**

The Project Hope Food Pantry was open weekly on Monday, Wednesday, and Fridays from 11:00 am until 2:45 pm. The Loaves & Fishes pantry at  $60^{th}$  and Walnut streets was open on the third Saturday morning monthly from 10:00 am – noon. The One14 Center pantry was open the first Sunday of the month from noon until 2:00 pm and the third Monday evening from 4:00 - 5:45 pm monthly.

- \*We provide a choice pantry service to our clients as needed every 30 days.
- \*Household paper products, laundry and cleaning products, personal hygiene items, and diapers are provided to our food pantry clients as available. Unfortunately, due to a lack of donations, these items were not available for several weeks this past year.
- \*We served 6,254 families including 20,689 individuals between our main pantry and our satellite pantries at St. Matthew Lutheran Church and Lutheran Church of the Master.
- \*We served 21.5% more families and 20.9% more individuals in 2024 than 2023.


#### **Clothing Pantry**

The Clothing Pantry was open two days a week on Tuesday and Thursday from 11:00 am until 2:00 pm.


- \*We served 2,060 households in the clothing pantry during 2024. This is a 36.7% increase over 2023.
- \*Clients may shop weekly for free clothing items for their household.
- \*ReRuns, an organization that sells used women and children's clothing in the Spring and Autumn, donated huge amounts of unsold clothing to Project Hope following each event.

#### **Client Information**

The data below reflects unduplicated information for 2,507 households totaling 8,409 individual clients served at Project Hope during 2024.

#### **Provisions**

We served our clients food provided by the Foodbank for the Heartland, local organizations and churches, individual food donations, and the items we purchased from local grocery stores in Omaha.

- \*We spent \$77,922 at the local grocery stores and Whispering Roots purchasing food items needed for the pantry. This was a 23% increase over the amount spent in 2023.
- \*44 local businesses and church organizations delivered food, personal hygiene items, laundry and cleaning products, and clothing to Project Hope over 411 times in 2024.
- \*Local churches and individuals provided fresh produce in the summer and fall from their gardens.
- \*The Food Bank for the Heartland provided free food to Project Hope 50 weeks in 2024. During 2024 we received 69,927 pounds of food from the Food Bank. This was a 49% increase over 2023.
- \*The Saving Grace organization made over 88 deliveries to Project Hope with food from local restaurants, grocery and convenience stores on Tuesday and Thursdays.
- \*The Whispering Roots organization provided us with donations of food at least 38 weeks this year including our produce boxes weekly except during July, August, and September.
- \*Lord of Love Lutheran Church supplied our clients with fresh produce from their parish gardens during the months of July, August, and September.

#### Time & Talent Donations ~ Our Volunteers

Our volunteers checked clients into our Pantry Soft program, collected the food selections for our clients, sacked all the food, and delivered all the items to the vehicles, loading them into the trunk or backseat, picked up food from the Food Bank for the Heartland, processed food and clothing donations, assisted clients in the clothing pantry, as well as cleaned and organized the facility.

- \*Project Hope had 41 volunteers serving in the pantry during 2024.
- \*Volunteers served a total of 5,166.25 hours in 2024 for an average of 430.5 hours per month.
- \*It would have cost us \$77,493.75 in wages if we needed to pay part-time staff \$15 per hour to do the jobs our volunteers complete. However, the value of volunteering in the State of Nebraska during 2024 was rated at \$31.07 per hour. That puts the value of our volunteers at \$160,515!

#### **Financial Gifts**

#### **Grants Received**

Project Hope was successful in obtaining some very significant grants for our operating budget this year. The Suzanne & Walter Scott Foundation provided us with a \$15,000 Omaha Award. The Pape Family Foundation gave us \$10,000. We received a \$5,000 grant from an anonymous foundation. The St. Matthew Lutheran Church Endowment Fund awarded us with a \$3,000 grant. The Soener Foundation and the William E and Rose Marie Davis Foundation gave us grants worth \$2,000 each. We also received \$1,000 grants from The Bill and Leona Kernen Family and the Vandervort Family Fund.

Six grants were received to help purchase food for our clients. The MetLife Foundation provided us with a \$10,000 food grant. The International Paper Foundation gave us a \$8,000 food grant and The Farm Credit Service of America awarded us a \$5,000 grant. Grace Lutheran Church Endowment Fund sent us \$2,500 for our food purchases. Walmart provided \$1,250, The Nebraska Synod ELCA gave a \$1,000 grant, and Costco provided a \$500 grant.

We received a \$2,000 grant from the Food Bank for the Heartland for new equipment. We used this to purchase a large stainless-steel table with wheels and a lower shelf.

#### **Monetary Donors**

We received monetary donations from 200 individuals and 34 organizations or businesses. Individuals provided us with over \$80,000 in financial support, this includes donations made in association with our fundraisers and designated funds. Unfortunately, this is a decrease of 31.6% from 2023. Individuals also donated money through American Online Giving, the Kroger Corporation, Network for Good, Together A Greater Good (TAGG), Benevity, Conagra Brands Foundation, Omaha Community Foundation, and Thrivent National. Churches and other business organizations provided over \$33,000 in monetary gifts. In addition to cash and checks, donations can be made with debit or credit cards via our website and with investment transfers to our Charles Schwab account. Legacy Gifts can be made to our Endowment Fund through the ELCA Foundation Ministry Growth Fund.

#### **Fundraisers & Campaigns**

We organized and raised funds through three fundraisers and campaigns during 2024. Project Hope raised \$3,500 with the "Do Good Week" campaign in April. On September 22<sup>nd</sup> we held our sixth "Bread for Life" fundraiser and raised over \$15,000 gross income. We ended the year with our End of the Year campaign starting with Giving Tuesday the week following Thanksgiving and raised over \$15,000. All three fundraisers and campaigns provided less income than the previous year.


#### 2024 Revenue
