TAA RENEWS CIRCLE A ACCREDITATION

Circle A is thrilled to again receive accreditation from the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance. The TAA remains the only accrediting body in Thoroughbred aftercare, and their rigorous accreditation process—including standards which must be met and maintained by organizations seeking accreditation—is approved by both the American Humane Association and the American Association of Equine Practitioners. The five key areas encompassed by the Code of Standards are operations, education, horse health care management, facility standards and services, and adoption policies and protocol.

As one of only 86 TAA accredited facilities nationwide, Circle A is honored to be recognized as an organization committed to the wellbeing of horses.



It didn't take long before Circle A's mission expanded from healing horses to healing at risk-children. Children's homes and shelters would bring young people to the rescue as outings. Alicia saw the healing bond between horse and child (something she always knew existed) and formed a plan that has developed into regular therapy programs for at-risk children. The program moved into the community partnering with the Norfolk Police Department's Community Program. I really enjoy working with horses and love working with the children.
