### Outdoor Burn Period

### Things to Know before Burning

- Burn barrels are illegal.
- Garbage burning is illegal.(See back for reference)
- The burn pile must be smaller than 4'x4'x3'.
- You may burn only one pile at a time.
- Your smoke must not impact your neighbors, and you must put out your fire if it does.
- Do not leave your fire unattended.
- The fire **should not** include materials hauled from another property.
- It is illegal to burn construction and demolition debris.
- Burning on any city or county street, road or alley is prohibited.
- It is not allowed regardless of this permit to burn, on Sundays and Poor Air Quality days.

**The following materials may not be disposed of by outdoor burning:**

- (a) any waste moved from the premises where it was generated;
- (b) food wastes;
- (c) styrofoam and other plastics;
- (d) wastes generating noxious odors;
- (e) lumber, including untreated lumber, and wood by-products, such as paper and cardboard; (Untreated lumber may be burned in wood burning stoves.)
- (f) poultry litter;
- (g) animal droppings;
- (h) dead animals or dead animal parts;
- (i) tires;
- (j) rubber materials;
- (k) asphalt shingles;
- (l) tar paper;
- (m) automobile or aircraft bodies and interiors;
- (n) insulated wire;
- (o) oil or petroleum products;
- (p) treated lumber and timbers;
- (q) pathogenic wastes;
- (r) trade wastes;
- (s) any materials resulting from a salvage operation;
- (t) chemicals;
- (u) Christmas tree waste;
- (v) asbestos or asbestos-containing materials;
- (w) standing or demolished structures; and paint
