Lagoon

Watch for flyers regarding the days/times **the lagoon** will be open. Yard debris only.

City of Sprague Ordinance #747 governs the disposal of debris at the lagoon dumping grounds, establishing rules and penalties for misuse. Any person dumping at the site needs to remit \$3.00 for each pickup load and \$8.00 for each truckload.

A pickup load is when the load does not require the entire space of a truck, also known as less than truckload (LTL); whereas full truckload (TL) takes up the space or weight limit of an entire trailer.

Ordinance #823 - Weeds

Our recent fire in town is a good reminder to please keep lawns green, clear weeds, and other fire hazards from your property. The house you save may be your own or your neighbors. We need to make sure to water and keep our yards, alleys, and properties free of weeds and debris. Be safe.

MACABEE CEMETERY

The cemetery district will have a special levy on the November ballot. The special levy amount will be for a one-year collection in the amount of \$35,000 (.31 cents per thousand). Our last special levy was four years ago.

We operate on a limited budget with the maintenance labor absorbing all the revenue received from our annual tax collection of \$9,000. We need your help to continue additional updates. The new electrical system was recently completed with 3 phase wiring and new switches. Our future project goals are to repair the entrance roadway & circle and to add signage to the entrance of Lakeview. No future projects can be completed without additional funding.

With the help of students with their Senior Projects, our new information sign at the entrance update was completed by Hannah Brittain. Row markers were being designed by other seniors, however, COVID put a halt to that for now. Hopefully, a future Senior Project can complete this project in the future. We welcome any future project suggestions.

We would appreciate a 'YES' vote for our levy in November.
