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Riverhead Road Drainage/Erosion

At a recent June 19, 2006 meeting in the Sound Beach Fire House, Highway Supervisor John Rouse spoke to an assembly of local residents concerned about the flooding of local roads and the bluff erosion at the Riverhead Road beach area in Sound Beach. From some of the residents speaking at this meeting, it was apparent that an accurate representation of the circumstances surrounding these problems may not be circulating throughout our community. always amazes me how perceptions of things not going right or not being done correctly seem to have traction and spread quickly, while the positive actions and activities of people and organiza-

tions seem to have more difficulty rising to the same level of community awareness.

In 1965, the SBPOA granted easements to the Town Of Brookhaven at the ends of Riverhead Road and between Amagansett and Brookhaven roads for the purpose of allowing the town to install drainage systems to direct the highway water runoff into the Long Island Sound during major storms. These easements require the town to maintain the areas. At the time, the sensitivity to coastline environmental issues of hull-heads and

tain the areas. At the time, the sensitivity to coastline environmental issues of bulkheads and roadway runoff into the sound had not yet become a government issue. Subsequently, the building of bulkheads and directing of any effluent into natural estuaries have become national hot buttons requiring DEC approvals and permits, and result in time delays due to the lengthy time required to obtain them.

From 1965 onward, the SBPOA maintained a communication link with the town highway department to facilitate the required repairs. This was relatively successful until the aging and the continued hammering of these wooden bulkheads during major storms caused them to fail. The town solution (not supported by the SBPOA) was to build gabions in an attempt to salvage the quickly deteriorating wooden bulkhead structures. Over the years many attempts to rebuild the Riverhead Road drainage area gabion retainment soluwith tions and in-house piping installations all failed, the systems collapsed and the stairways to the beach went with them.

SBPOA continued to press for re-bulk heading of the twoeasement areas, as bulkheads are the only north shore bluff containment system that has proven to be effective against the damaging nor'easter storms that occasion our area. In 2004, we wrote letters to and met with Legislator Dan Losquadro, Councilman Kevin McCarrick and Highway Supervisor John Rouse to expose the dangerous condition that was developing at the Riverhead Road easement, a sinkhole had opened up and the bulkhead/gabion restraint system was in immanent danger of collapse. September 10, 2004, John Rouse and his highway foreman met with us on the beach and we laid out a plan of attack to rebuild the bulkhead, and the drainage system. Estimates were prepared, an engineering firm was contracted to design a proper system, funding was being identified and secured and the DEC was brought on board to affect an approved pro-

During the time interval that all this was transpiring, deterioration continued until a series of major rainfalls starting in December 2005 caused the bulkhead to collapse, taking the bluff, drainage system, stairs and surrounding area out into

the sound. Around the clock repair efforts, comprised of blocking off drains on the surrounding streets, dumping sand and installing temporary cement cesspool rings to protect the residences immediately adjacent to the area, temporarily brought some stabilization to the area. There have been major rain events that continued to cause crosion problems, but the town highway department is on top of them as they occur and is maintaining the bluff stability.

At the June 19th 2006 meeting at the firehouse, John Rouse gave an update on where the project stands today. A recent delay caused by a request from Suffolk County for more engineering has been satisfied. All funding is in place as are all approvals. The project has grown to include all the bluff area that eroded as a direct result of damage from the town's easement drainage site. It will remove the stop gap cesspool rings and rocks at the base of the bluff, provide approximately 250 feet of new bulkhead to close the gap between the existing bulkheads, a new drainage system which will recontaminates and allow only environmentally friendly water into the sound, restore the bluff face and plant vegetation as well as add catch basins throughout the local road system to drastically reduce flooding and retain the water locally before it makes its way north towards the beach.

We have asked John Rouse to keep us informed so an accurate project status can circulate within our community and we will be able to coordinate our beach activities with the town's construction project anticipated to start in the very near future. Why not stop down to the top of the west beach stairs, enjoy a beautiful sunset and pick up the latest on the restoration project. Hope to see you there.


