This is done in the general police work of the town at no cost to the individual property owner. This is only of the many services that are available to us as tax payers in Brookhaven Town.

- 2. Dispose of all clothes that have been used for floorwax, furniture polish or other inflammable materials.
- 3. Return empty milk bottles. An empty bottle left lying in the sun may act as a perfect burning glass, which accounts for the beginning of many grass fires.
- 4. Remove fuses from electric boxes. Turn off gas at tank. Be sure gasoline or kerosene is stored in suitable container away from house if possible.
- 5. Store small quantities of sugar, flour, cereals, etc., in glass jars or

tins, and plug all small holes in floors—just in case the mice decide to set up housekeeping.

These are just a few of the things that come to mind. Probably you can think of many more.





NOVEMBER MEETING

It is with great regret that we must report, that due to lack of a quorum, our Corporation was unable to officially transact the necessary business at our annual meeting, which is the legal meeting required in accordance with the membership corporation law of the State of New York.

Considering the fact that the members of the Board of Directors and members of various committees give up a large part of their time, at considerable cost to themselves, it does not seem that they are getting a square deal to have only an insignificant percentage of our membership showing any indication of a spirit of co-operation, to say nothing of one of appreciation.

An organization such as the S. B. P. O. Ass'n, Inc., when almost all the service is given gratuitously through the efforts of volunteers, it is absolutely essential to have enthusiasm and a spirit of community

service.

Experience has proven time and time again that without some recognition and cooperation on the part of those receiving the benefits, this enthusiasm and spirit gradually wanes with the accompanying loss of efficiency and interest.

Many of our members have made the very flattering statement that their lack of attendance was due to the fact, that they were entirely satisfied with the manner in which the affairs of the corporation are conducted

While, as stated above, this attitude is very flattering, it does not overcome the legal obstacle, namely that business cannot be transacted without a quorum present.

to a number small enough to make a meeting legal, but this means that the corporation will be at the mercy of any small organized group, which may or may not have an axe to grind.

It is the feeling of the present Board of Directors and officers that unless a considerable proportion of the membership show more interest in the future than in the past, that we might just as well fold up now and let nature take it's course.

It will without doubt be a most expensive demonstration of the need of an active, honest and well run organization in a community such as ours.

The present organization is the result of approximately ten years of hard, thankless work on the part of relatively few people and it is very doubtful that it would be duplicated in twice that length of time in the event that lack of interest on the part of the membership caused a dissolution of the present organization.

Our organization is not in any sense an autocratic or totalitarian racket and its future rest entirely in the hands of the general membership.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

In addition to the routine affairs, accounts of which have appeared in the minutes of the Board and will be shown more completely in the forthcoming financial statement, the Board is gratified to be able to report on two major activities conceived and carried through during the past year.

The first is the new electric pump installed at the Community House. It has a capacity sufficient to take care of any reasonable demand for years to come and in addition to the actual pump capacity, a reservoir has been installed which will provide approximately ten thousand gallons of water in reserve without drawing upon the pump. Three outside faucets have been provided which are replaced with a frost proof hydrant in the winter. In addition to those a pipe line and hydrant has been provided for the use of the fire apparatus making a plentiful supply of water in Sound Beach at all times.

The second major accomplishment during the past year was the construction of the new club house to take the place of the one which was destroyed by fire early in the year.

As doubtless everyone in Sound Beach has seen the building it is not necessary to go into details concerning its construction and equipment. A complete report of the cost of construction and equipment will be published in the January issue of the Bulletin.
