I know it has been a long time since you have been able to peruse our shelves. You've had to order books from Amazon or search on your electronic devices. Well, NO MORE. Now, you can experience the satisfaction of actually holding a book in your hands and not pay for it.

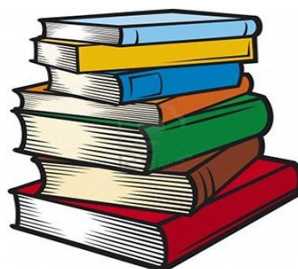
Many of our residents know about the main Centennial Library. Our newer residents may not be aware of its existence. The library is located in Building 12 across from the gym. Our hours are anytime that you have the urge to pull yourself away from the TV. We have many fiction books in various physical styles. Some people like the feel of a hard bound book - we have those. Or the lighter pocket books - we have those. Or soft bound books, which are larger than the pocket books - we have those. There is also a selection of books with larger print to make reading easier for our mature eyes. There is romance, mystery and intrigue in all styles.

The non-fiction selections cover many topics; autobiographies/memoirs, cookbooks, self-help, war, politics, sports. We even have a small section of Reader's Digests for those who like to read a condensed version. Also, there is a small section of books in Russian located to the left of the window.

In addition, to the more than **1500** books, a resident donated their library of DVD's which include mysteries, comedies, Broadway shows. We have CDs of classic music, books on tape and listening music. AND there are Jigsaw puzzles ranging from 300 pieces to 1000 pieces for those who like a challenge. My previous partner and I have decorated the library with completed and framed puzzles.

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SAFETY RULES TO ATTEND ACTIVITIES



It has become necessary for our community members to increase the safety levels due to the increase in the spread of COVID 19. The Delta variant has increased the danger of this pandemic.

Therefore, the Board has been advised by our attorney that if we are to open our ballroom for meetings, entertainment, dining etc., we will require the following.

1. Everyone, without exception, will need to present their CDC card proving they have received their 2 COVID 19 vaccine shots at least 2 weeks prior to the event.
2. Everyone needs to have signed the Covid Wavier, previously distributed in April (or sign one at the door before entering)
3. Everyone must wear a mask while in and around the ballroom when not actively eating or drinking.
4. All food and drinks will be distributed by designated volunteers.
