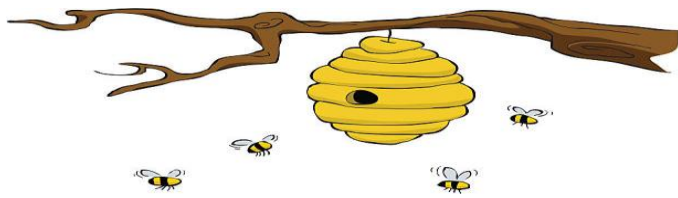

# CELEBRATING CENTENNIAL'S CENTENARIAN- RITA COLELLA



# THE RITA COLELLA STORY,

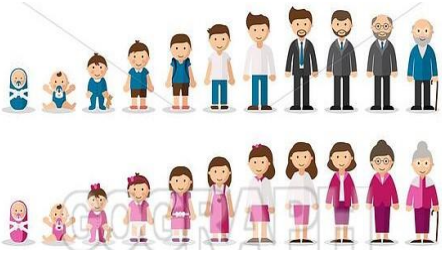


Born at home, common at that time, in the West Kensington section of Philadelphia, Rita Colella arrived in the world on April 13, 1922. Rita first attended Saint Boniface grade school, at Hancock and Diamond streets, around the corner from where she lived. After St. Boniface, Rita went on to Hallahan High School graduating in 1940. While in high school Rita played as a forward on the school basketball team. Basketball has always been her favorite sport. Just a few years ago, while playing with her grandson in the back yard, she sunk 6 shots in a row. Astounding!

During World War II, Rita worked at the Frankford Arsenal assembling pins into fuses that were used in the manufacturing of bombs. In 1943, at a local dance, she met the man who would become her husband. She remembered how he had immediately caught her attention. In his *Zoot Suit* and black and white patent leather shoes he was special. They danced all night. They were later married in 1943 at Fort Riley Army base in Kansas. He was posted there for part of his army career, Later, all 6 of her children would serve in the armed forces, either in the army, navy or air force.

Anyone who has known Rita during her 17 years at Centennial Station will attest to her energy and exuberance for life. She loves dancing, the Phillies and yes, her family. When asked what most surprises this centenarian, she said, "the world seems to have grown very selfish." She is astounded how little people share with one another. She remembers how in her youth, people in her neighborhood would even share their skate keys so that everyone could play together. Today Rita's main focus is "having fun each and every day of her life." This is obvious by her wonderful laugh. For her bucket list item, Rita has been working on her autobiography starting at age 7 and so far, has completed the first 37 pages. That means there are only 963 more pages to go.

# CENTENNIAL PIONEERS – OUR LIVING HISTORY

These first residents had the opportunity to customize their units, resulting in each of the 410 units now being a unique residence. Kitchens were redesigned, entry doors, were relocated, and/or bedrooms or living rooms were expanded or reduced. Sharon Fishbein (pictures below) for instance, modified the outside storage room door to give it access from the inside. She also opened the wall between the kitchen and the entryway. Mary Ann Franklin, on the other hand, enlarged the living room, choosing to make the guest room smaller.

**In the following analysis the French Professor Bruno Dubois, Director of the Institute of Memory and Alzheimer's Disease (IMMA) at La Pitié-Salpêtrière - Paris Hospitals, addresses the subject in a rather reassuring way:**
