- 3. Consider how we may spur one another on towards love and good deeds;
- 4. Not give up meeting together;

- 5. Encourage one another;
- 6. Throw everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles;
- 7. Run with perserverance the race marked out for us;
- 8. Fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith.

May we all strive with God's help to do these, and may they be an encouragement to us and to our Christian brothers and sisters in Sierra Leone, as we all continue to live and work for Him.

Report from EFSL General Secretary Rev Jonathan Titus-Williams

Support for mudslide and flash flooding victims: With your support EFSL continues to provide relief assistance and support to vulnerable families at the displaced peoples holding centre at Culvert, Kissybrook, Freetown. These are just some of the victims of the mudslide and flooding that affected several communities in and around the capital on August 14, 2017. In February, 30 vulnerable households (177 people in total) were specifically targeted and served. They were provided with basic household utensils, such as plastic buckets, laundry containers, cups, plates and spoons, hygiene kits with soap, pastes, sanitary pads, clothing, bedspreads, etc. All these are otherwise completely unavailable to them.

Life in Sierra Leone: Since the Parliamentary and Presidential elections ended on the 31st March 2018, life has been relatively peaceful, and the political atmosphere is gradually settling down. The economic situation in the country is still challenging due to the huge financial loans left behind by the past government. The new government is working hard to improve on internal revenue generation. However, there is a heavy cry from the main opposition party that their party members are being removed from government positions. One of the EFSL Heads of the Christian Family Ministries, Rev Abraham Sesay-Jones, has been appointed the Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Trade and Industry. The current financial discipline adopted by the new government has been commended by the IMF during their visit last week, and they promise to make another visit in September to monitor the progress. There are great prospects ahead for the country if the new President and his government remain committed to the promises made to the people of Sierra Leone during the election campaign.



Radio Ministry: The Radio Ministry in Freetown resumed on the Believers Broadcasting Network in March 2018 despite the challenges participants face travelling long distances to the radio station. Programmes also started in Makeni on Sundays from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. and in Lunsar on Thursdays from 8:00 to 10:00 p.m. Phones calls received during the radio broadcast indicate that it is well appreciated by the communities. They see it as another source of spiritual enrichment apart from attending church services.

Study Bibles: We have not been able to reproduce NT tapes because pastors no longer request for them. The funds have been added to buy additional Study Bibles, making a total of 13 recently purchased (Study Bibles were out of stock for the past 3 months) and these will be distributed at the next EFSL Pastors Seminar to be held in Magburaka in July 2018. Sewing Machines: Three sewing machines were donated to the EFSL REAPS Vocational Institute to help boost the Dress Making Department that has struggled to repair 20 old sewing machines used by the students. There is still need for more sewing machines in the department as they have not been able to successfully repair the old machines. You can read more about this work at
