


Bill's service of thanksgiving

On 2nd August in Weston-Super-Mare, four of the Support EFSL trustees – Ken, Steve, Francis and Harry – had the privilege to attend the memorial thanksgiving service for the life of Bill Roberts, the founder of Support EFSL and to meet some of the many people who Bill shared his life with.

There have been many tributes given about Bill, both written and spoken. Here are a few: 'a very special friend,'

'a man of admirable spiritual strength and integrity,' 'his unwavering passion was to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ,' 'a gentle soul who loved his Saviour and wanted to share that love with others,' 'a godly man who lived and guided us in word and deed to become Christlike,' 'he took no political sides in the Biafran war but remained faithful to his brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the period of the war, sharing their many sorrows and their very few (if any) material joys,' 'an amazing British man, yet in many ways he lived like us Sierra Leoneans.'



One tribute mentioned that back in his time in Sierra Leone Bill had a favourite solo he would sing: 'I'd rather have Jesus'. I am sure Bill would want us all to 'rather have Jesus'!

Travelling Bible School

From 6 to 15 November, the EFSL team – Rev Joseph Baio (known as Bajoe), Rev Ken Wiebe, Rev Gadiru Basie, and Rev Charlie Bio – led Travelling Bible School seminars at Masiaka, Taiama, and Boajibu in southeast Sierra Leone.

At Taiama, Bajoe and Charlie spoke on church administration principals and pastoral ethics, and Gadiru very effectively added to Ken's teaching by addressing marriage issues from a different perspective.

On Monday there was a pastor present who has been estranged from his wife for nine years. He went to her and told her about the teaching on marriage, and asked her to attend. She came both Tuesday and Wednesday.



First steps of reconciliation have been made. No doubt there are major issues still needing to be addressed. But, praise God, they both responded positively to the whole assembly praying for them.



Jesus Film backpack projector

In February we procured a backpack projector with the Jesus Film pre-installed with 12 local Sierra Leonean languages, which Ken and Yvonne passed on to EFSL. Through a very generous donation we were able to buy another projector backpack (which Ken presented to EFSL when he attended the TBS) to aid EFSL in its work to share the Gospel and plant churches in remote, rural communities.

1,061 people attended and 273 made decisions to follow Jesus. The film was presented to them in their Susu language. One outstanding impact was to see the chief and his family accepting Christ over African Traditional Religion – reminding us of Acts 19:17-20.
