EFSL Travelling Bible School

Back in March Support EFSL participated and assisted in the latest Travelling Bible School (TBS) organised by EFSL. By visiting various regions of Sierra Leone, the TBS aims to encourage and train rural pastors who have not received formal bible training and boost both their ministry and their personal development. The EFSL Church Empowerment Department identified the locations in Koindu, Koidu and Kamakwie and mobilised rural pastors for the training. The training was led by Rev. Paul Kamanda, Rev. Michael Abdulai and Rev. Kenneth Wiebe (Support EFSL Chairman) and taught on the following subjects: Servant Leadership, Marriage and Family, Muslim Evangelism and How to Manage a Local Church. In total 136 persons attended the training sessions.

Rev Santos Coba-Kamara also presented on the topic 'Christian Ordinances and Rituals'. The feedback on all presentations was very positive. In all three towns, Paul Kamanda's sessions on Muslim Evangelism formed the highpoint of the training, because these places are Muslim dominated therefore the pastors were eager to learn how to evangelize Muslims.

The latest news on the work of the EFSL Church Empowerment Department

Funds from Support EFSL were used to provide food (rice, salt, maggi and onions) for 65 orphans in Modeadea and Thibornor communities in the Lokomassama Chiefdom in the Port Loko District.. The children have lost both parents during the ebola surge and are currently staying with relatives in their respective communities.



EFSL's motivation for supporting orphans is based on James 1:27 which says, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.

The distribution was done under the supervision of the EFSL General Secretary. The photo shows orphans in Thibornor after receiving food from EFSL.

For the past month one person with disability benefited from funds received from Support EFSL. We provided two days' meal for Foday and his family in Laminaya village. Foday is a sixteen year old disabled young man who lives with his grandmother in Laminaya village.

Life is very difficult for Foday and his grandmother. They depend on neighbours and relatives for food. Even though small, our intervention was timely for that family.
