Study Bibles for Pastors




Thank you for your support in prayer and giving in response to the request in the last newsletter to provide more study Bibles. As a result, EFSL has bought and distributed study Bibles to 10 Pastors in

hard-to-reach rural communities: Madina Seibureh and Torma Bum (Bonthe district), Fiama, Kombayede and Kaikondoh (Kono district), Bafodia and Kumala (Koinadugu district), and Mongo and Kamaron (Falaba District).

from EFSL. Both Fiama and Kombayende are hard-to-reach communities in Kono. Pastors in these communities do not have study aids such Bible dictionaries and concordances. After receiving the Bible, Pastors Mondeh and Kpakima joyfully said the study Bibles will aid them in preparing sermons.



... And Sewing Machines

EFSL also provided seven women with sewing machines procured with funding from Support EFSL. This activity aims to help beneficiaries to generate income for improved wellbeing. Below are three of the ladies who have received sewing machines this year.



Betty Lahai is a Christian young lady who has been trained as a seamstress and has served as an apprentice for two years in one of the

local tailor's shops. According Betty she has always prayed to God for money to buy a sewing machine. She said often customers come to me with clothes for sewing, but because I don't have access to a sewing machine, I missed the opportunity.

Elizabeth 'Finda' Essah is a single, young woman who has completed her studies in dressmaking. Despite her knowledge and skill, she was finding it difficult to make ends meet. Before the provision of the



sewing machine, she spent her days helping male dressmakers who had their own machines. Her experiences were not pleasant; in most cases she reported being paid very little for her work. After receiving the sewing machine Elizabeth declared, "With this machine I can now establish my own business and develop a client base. To God be the glory."



Isata Bundor is 35 years old and married with three children. She and her family live in the crowded East End of Freetown. Isata is a Christian and had always desired to learn a trade in which she could be self-employed and contribute financially to the upkeep of her home. She made that dream a reality by enrolling in a home management course at a technical vocational school in Freetown, specialising in dressmaking.

After completing the course, she still needed a sewing machine to effectively ply her trade. Unfortunately, after two years she had still not been able to buy one. So, as she puts it, "I take everything to God prayer. All these years, I prayed to God for a sewing machine, and finally today I have got one through EFSL." Isata thanks God and donors for their support.

Other Ministries Aided by Support EFSL

Regular monthly funding from Support EFSL ensures that the Evangelical Fellowship's evangelism department and its activities remain sustainable. Our support also serves as the major income stream for three rural Pastors – Pastor Robert Conteh (Komoye Village), Pastor James Coker (Morwagor Village, Mattru Jong), and Pastor Joseph Sorsorwah. It helps these rural pastors pay not only for basic needs, but also for their children's education and health care. Please continue to prayer for these pastors and for the work of the evangelism department.

Plans for the rest of 2023

Support EFSL Chairman Ken Wiebe is awaiting confirmation of target communities and other details for another Travelling Bible School in November. He is projecting for at least 50 pastors and other church leaders to enrol for a three-day seminar in each of three separate rural centres. He also wants to ensure that the pastor of each church represented receives a study Bible.
