Travelling Bible School

Sierra Leone has many rural pastors who carry out their ministries in remote, Muslim-dominated communities. The aim of EFSL's Travelling Bible School (TBS) is to provide teaching, encouragement, and a rare opportunity for peer-to-peer fellowship for these under-resourced pastors. Last month, Support EFSL had the privilege to co-sponsor and take part in three TBS seminars.

At Bonthe, Sherbro Island



The seminar on beautiful Sherbro Island was very well attended, and the delegates responsive and appreciative of our effort to come, by

boat, to such a remote town. 50 delegates had been invited, but 60 turned up. Kevin and Harry led morning devotions; Ken, and Pastors Joseph and Michael (EFSL staff), shared the teaching sessions.







At Grafton and Mile 91

The Grafton TBS seminar surprised with its readiness for discussion and feedback. Grafton is on the outskirts of Freetown, so it is to be expected that more delegates have formal Bible training and might be keen to

interact on the topics.

As in the other seminars, Pastor Joseph taught on 'Evangelism & Discipleship',

Pastor Michael (pictured) on 'Church Management', and Ken's topics were 'Servant Leadership' and 'Christian Marriage.'

Fifty-seven delegates attended the TBS at Mile 91. The hosting pastor $\,$

expressed his pleasure, as there has been a tendency in the town for the various Christian leaders to keep to themselves. There was discussion on cultural practises/secret societies, a subject often feared to be spoken of. Some still suffer 'effects' from being initiated as children. Two of the older women showed up early the next day and expressed thanks for the teaching on this topic.

Matters for praise and prayer:

 The attendance and positive engagement of rural pastors and other delegates at the TBS seminars; pray that they will to take back to their churches the things they have learned. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20.
