

I am Nithya Mariappan, a Ph.D. graduate from the University of Madras, Chennai. Currently, I serve as a Clinical Scientist at Proteus Genomics Laboratory in Birmingham, Alabama, where I specialize in pharmacogenetic testing and clinical research aimed at improving patient care. I am happily married to Selvam Raja, a lead consultant at Infosys, and blessed with a daughter, Anju. She is currently pursuing her undergraduate degree in Computer Engineering at Auburn University and is also a talented singer and accomplished classical dancer.

Tell us about your journey to the USA:

Nithya Mariappan

I owe everything I am today to my Appa and Amma—their love, sacrifices, and unwavering belief in me have shaped my path. My sisters and all my family members have been my strongest support, helping me overcome every challenge. They are my greatest blessing, and I am forever grateful to them.

My journey from India to the United States began with a deep passion for research. After earning my Ph.D. from the University of Madras, Chennai, I moved to the U.S. in 2005 to pursue Cardiovascular studies at Louisiana State University (LSU). In 2015, I joined the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), where I contributed advancements in cardio-pulmonary research. Currently, I am transitioning into the role of Clinical Scientist at Proteus Genomics, a clinical reference laboratory in Birmingham, Alabama, specializing in clinical diagnostic research. I am actively engaged in various clinical research initiatives focused on enhancing patient care. These efforts aim to improve early diagnosis, personalized treatment, and overall patient outcomes.

Beyond my scientific career, I have also ventured into entrepreneurship by starting a small food catering business, called **"Ambur to Alabama."** Balancing my role as a researcher and business owner has been both challenging and rewarding, allowing me to pursue my passion for food while continuing my contributions to science. As a woman in both research and business, I take pride in navigating these dual roles, managing my time effectively, and maintaining a commitment to excellence in multiple fields. Looking ahead, I remain dedicated to advancing clinical research while expanding my entrepreneurial endeavors, with the goal of making a meaningful impact in both healthcare and the culinary world.

Tell us about your challenges and how you overcame them?

One of the toughest challenges I faced was leaving my family when I moved to the U.S. Being away from my parents and loved ones was incredibly difficult. However, knowing my sister would take care of everything in my absence gave me the strength to move forward. Staying connected with my family and relying on their ongoing support helped me overcome this challenge.

Moving from India to the USA as a researcher and a married woman with a family came with many challenges, especially in understanding the American academic system. One of the biggest hurdles was maintaining a work-life balance. Managing research, family responsibilities, and household tasks initially felt overwhelming. Struggling with time management led to stress, but I overcome this by creating a structured routine and sharing responsibilities with my spouse.

Adapting to a new culture also required adjusting to different social norms and daily habits. To ease this transition, I participated in cultural exchange programs and built a strong support network of friends and colleagues, which helped me feel more at home.

Raising a child while blending Indian and American cultures came with its own set of challenges. At home, we celebrate Indian festivals, speak Tamil to keep a strong connection with grandparents, and cook traditional meals. At the same time, I encourage my child to embrace American traditions like celebrating Thanksgiving and participating in school activities. This balance allows my child to appreciate both cultures and adapt comfortably to life in the USA. Teaching her Tamil, our culture, classical dance, and Carnatic music was not easy, but we remained dedicated to keeping her connected to our roots.

Tell us about your hobbies and interests outside your family and work?

Outside of family and work, I have several hobbies that keep me active and contribute to my personal growth. One of my main passions is cooking, which inspired me to start **Ambur to Alabama**, a business focused on offering high-quality, home-style meals made with fresh, locally sourced ingredients. I enjoy experimenting with different cuisines and sharing my love for food.

I also take pleasure in gardening and practice yoga to maintain my physical and mental well-being. Additionally, I value sleeping and taking time to rest as part of my self-care routine. These hobbies keep me creative, balanced, and motivated, bringing fresh perspectives to both my work and personal life.

What do you value the most?

I believe in the importance of strong relationships, honesty, and the value of time. Life is more meaningful when shared with others, built on trust and kindness. Every day is an opportunity to learn, improve, and make a positive difference. Let's keep supporting each other, making memories, and creating an impact. Additionally, I enjoy reading, as it helps me unwind and expand my knowledge.

Indeed, the day may have come to an end, but for the women of the Alabama Tamil Sangam Community, it was only the beginning of something extraordinary.










