Lavanya Kumaran & Family

Tell us about your journey to USA and your family

We are from Chennai, India. My name is Lavanya. I received my Master's degree in Medical Electronics from Anna University. I started my professional career in academia, where I was able to combine my technical background and passion for teaching for more than 12 years as an assistant professor at Sri Venkateswara College of Engineering.

My spouse, Kumaran, is a software engineer with over 21 years of experience and currently works as an Engineering Manager at Adtran. Throughout my journey, he has consistently offered support and encouragement. We are proud parents of two exceptionally talented daughters. Our eldest, Adhithi Shree, is pursuing theater at the Alabama School of Fine Arts (ASFA) and a passionate dancer and artist.

She has earned numerous accolades, including awards from the prestigious Trumbauer competition for acting. Our younger daughter, Gobhika Shree, is academically gifted and the recipient of several honors from Simmons School, such as the Exemplary and Outstanding Student Awards. She has also published five works and was recently accepted into ASFA's creative writing program.

In 2016, our family embarked on a new chapter by relocating to Portland, Oregon. After eight years there, we moved to Alabama.

How did you develop an interest in teaching Tamil, art and folk arts?

After relocating to Portland, Oregon, in 2016, my husband Kumaran and I launched a sincere project to provide free Tamil classes to kids. Our mission was to preserve our rich culture and inspire children to love and learn Tamil. What started out as a modest deed of kindness quickly spread internationally. Through online and in-person sessions, I have now instructed more than 500 kids in Tamil across the United States and Canada. I currently teach Tamil to over 150 children in six active batches through our organization, Zhagaram Foundation. I teach languages, but I also teach art to children, both in-person and online. I've experimented with mediums like acrylic and have a strong affinity for sketching, particularly with color pencil and charcoal. Recently, I've been focusing on mastering Kerala mural art.

My contributions to Tamil education has been recognized through several awards, such as the Pride of Charity Award from the Nova Awards and the Prime Hero Award (2020) for Tamil teaching service. During my time in Oregon, I also worked as a substitute teacher for the Beaverton School District.

Under the auspices of Zhagaram Foundation, we also established the Portland Kalai Kuzhu while we were there, uniting over 40 people to celebrate and perform traditional Tamil folk arts such as Parai, Silambam, and Oyilattam. We have rekindled our enthusiasm by starting a new group under Zhagaram Kalai Kuzhu after moving to Alabama, and we are still spreading the spirit of our culture. Through Zhagaram Foundation, we are giving monetary support for transgenders in TamilNadu.

What was the trigger or spark to pursue these art forms?

In my opinion, my dad is a gifted artist. I have enjoyed drawing since I was a young child, but I stopped after the tenth grade to focus on my studies. However, I resumed drawing after arriving in the United States. Kumaran is a deeply engaged member of the community. While we were in Chennai, he organized health and blood donation camps. He makes meaningful contributions to society and always strives to help others. He volunteers extensively.

My passion lies in teaching. When we first arrived in the United States, we believed most students here did not speak Tamil. Since we both love Tamil, we decided to teach Tamil to children, initially starting classes at home. Later, we thought about incorporating folk dance, so we choreographed parai and began teaching it to children. At that time, our trainer introduced us to parai and suggested forming a band. Eventually, we chose to expand our focus to all forms of folk arts instead of just parai. To represent this broader scope, we named our group Kalai Kuzhu, meaning "art troupe." We then started gathering various talents in Tamil folk arts. Our shared passion for these arts made this possible. Since our children also showed great interest in the arts, we dedicated ourselves to supporting them in pursuing artistic careers.

How do you encourage your children to stay rooted in Tamil culture?

From the start, we were confident in our decision to speak our native language at home. The teachers at school supported this approach, reassuring us that the children would naturally pick up English at school. Our kids now say that because we've created the impression that we don't speak English, they are "forced" to talk to us in Tamil. We also ask our Tamil-speaking friends to use Tamil instead of English when they visit our home. Every summer, we travel to India for vacation, taking the kids to our native village so they can observe and experience that way of life firsthand. We make sure they spend quality time and have fun with their grandparents during these visits.

Having lived in Oregon, what advice/learning would you like to share with the ATS community?

Although I'm not part of the executive panel, I've been actively involved in organizing cultural activities at ATS. From my experience, the Tamil community here is relatively small, and we have far fewer sponsors compared to the Portland Tamil Mandram. With more sponsorship support, we could achieve much more.

As the principal to the Alabama Tamil Academy, What is your vision and future plans for the ATS/ATA community?

When I expressed my interest in volunteering, Srini in ATA kindly gave me the flexibility to teach in my own style. I mentioned that I was also attending other classes, and he assured me it wouldn't be an issue. I truly enjoy spending time with children. I initially started with three energetic kids, so I choose a fun and engaging approach to make the learning enjoyable for them. Being new to the area, I was grateful for the support I received from the other teachers, which made me feel welcomed. I was particularly excited about the Tamil School Annual Day. Although we had limited time to prepare, the event was a great success thanks to the incredible support from the parents. They even helped arrange the props, and their involvement was truly impressive and encouraging. My teaching approach is not overly academic. I believe learning should be engaging, not forced. I want children to study with genuine interest and involvement. Tamil is not just a language; it offers so much more to explore and enjoy.

I'm planning to encourage children to develop a love for reading, especially since many kids today are moving away from books. A key part of my teaching will be storytelling, as it's a powerful way to impart life values and lessons in an enjoyable manner.

We follow the "Kadhai Vazhi Kalvi" (story-based learning) approach, which children truly enjoy. I'm planning to set up a library at the Tamil school to encourage students to read storybooks and develop a love for reading. My core belief is: "இஷ்டப்பட்டு படிக்கணும், கஷ்டப்பட்டு படிக்க கூடாது" learning should be driven by interest, not pressure. Support from parents is essential; they play a key role in helping children understand the value of learning a language. Encouraging kids through everyday use of Tamil words and exposure to Tamil media can make learning more natural and enjoyable. I'm also working with my team to organize story-based workshops that will further enhance their learning experience.

When I was in Portland, we used to organize a Kalai Thiruvizha every year. As part of the event, we participated in various folk art performances with different teams. I also conducted a workshop on Sangailakiyam for children. The kids took the initiative to form their own teams, and I organized a quiz competition with a cash prize to encourage participation. I'm now planning to implement similar activities here in Alabama as well.

What is your advice and what you admire the most from the younger generation?

I truly admire the confidence of the younger generation. They are unafraid to pursue what they love, and I've learned this fearless attitude from them. As an artist, I believe there are no strict rules, just like in art, where we can choose any color and create freely. Today's kids are confident and independent thinkers. However, I feel that focus is becoming a challenge, especially in recent years with the increasing influence of social media in their lives. It's important for children to cultivate the habit of reading books. I've noticed that as kids grow into their teenage years, they tend to withdraw from open conversations. At our home, we encourage our children to interact with any guests who visit, helping them build confidence and communication skills.

Please share any message to the community?

Staying connected to our roots is essential. It's our responsibility to pass our culture on to the next generation. We are always here to support ATS in any mission.


