With the fire of a survivor, the faith of a warrior and the stage presence of a seasoned pro, Kalah Lovegrove is redefining what it means to rise in stand-up comedy. Known for her unfiltered honesty, unwavering resilience and infectious humour, Kalah has a unique ability to connect with people of all races, religions, ages and walks of life, leaving audiences laughing, encouraged and inspired by her faith through adversity.

Kalah is an award-winning Aboriginal Christian comedian, speaker, and creative entrepreneur whose work blends humour, healing, and faith to empower the next generation. A proud Ngarrindjeri woman from Raukkan, South Australia, and a single mother of four, Kalah draws on her lived experience with courage and compassion, speaking boldly yet gently on themes of trauma, domestic violence, parenting, faith and resilience, inviting both laughter and healing.

Kalah began her stand-up comedy career in February 2024, after entering Australia's largest First Nations comedy competition, Deadly Funny, inspired by her late mother's encouragement and the support of her relative Kevin Kropinyeri. Just weeks after writing her first set, Kalah performed in the SA State Final, where her raw, uplifting style captivated audiences. She went on to win the State Final and later shared the national title at the Deadly Funny Grand Final during the Melbourne International Comedy Festival, performing to a crowd of over 500.

Since then, her comedy journey has been fast-tracked. She performed at Adelaide Fringe with the Aboriginal Comedy All Stars (her third ever stand-up set!) after being personally invited by Producer, Wes Snelling, to fill in for Andy Saunders. She has since featured at Comedy Club for Kids, Festival Club, and the Comedy Festival Roadshow across regional Victoria, and opened for Vanessa Larry Mitchell in *Teardrops On My D#!&!* at Murray Bridge Performing Arts Centre.

Kalah has taken part in industry development programs such as the Funny Mob pilot program curated by Tom Dickins at Arts Centre Melbourne and has worked alongside respected comedians including Janty Blair, Leon Filewood, Claire Hooper, Andy Saunders, Greg Larsen, and more. She also performed in the Kungari Comedy NAIDOC Showcase curated by Kimmie Lovegrove.

Known for "running down her kids on stage" (with their permission, of course), she brings vulnerability and comedic genius together in a way that resonates across cultures and generations.

Beyond the mic, Kalah is a survivor-advocate who has supported thousands of women through her digital platform @kalahzkillinit. She now merges her ministry and creative talents under Kalah Lovegrove Comedy, a division of Kalah Lovegrove Enterprises (KLE).

Through **Kalah Lovegrove Enterprises (KLE)**, Kalah leads a diverse range of creative and community-driven ventures:

□ KLCComedy, which includes:

- *Straight Outta Church* - solo comedy show
- *Sigma Stage Rizz* – a performing arts and youth empowerment program
- *Deadly & Drippin'* – a goal-setting & confidence workshop for Aboriginal students
- *Drip & Discipleship* – biblical speaking engagements for Gen Alpha
- *Real Talk Rizz* – school sessions addressing identity, healing and leadership in secular settings

□ KLDesign Studio, her graphic design business producing branding and promotional materials for herself and fellow artists. She has designed for fellow artists Shauntai Abdul-Rahman, Janty Blair, Leon Filewood and Kimmie Lovegrove.

□ KLCleaning, her community-focused cleaning service on Ngarrindjeri Country.

□ KLCoaching, encompassing her healing and empowerment programs Feathers of Freedom and Sistaz Staying Sober, which support survivors of domestic violence and women on their journey to sobriety.

Whether she's lighting up a stage, equipping youth or helping women rise after trauma and addiction, Kalah is committed to her mission: to deliver humour, hope, and healing, anchored in faith, driven by purpose and fuelled by the call to never give up.
