Ve are thrilled to announce that Ineke Zondag, leader of FFLV and Founder/President of FFLV USA, participated in the 68th annual Commission on the Status of Women (CSW68) at the United Nations HQ in New York. This global platform serves as a powerful arena for advocating gender equality and women's empowerment.

"Gender equality is not just a goal; it's a fundamental human right, leading the path to a brighter, fairer future for all." 22nd, emphasized the urgent need to accelerate progress towards gender equality and elevate women out of poverty. Unfortunately, gender equality has reversed since COVID-19, and we find ourselves back at square one. Women are disproportionately affected by disasters, conflicts, and inflation compared to men, highlighting the crucial work FFLV has been doing since day one.

The current rate of progress toward ending poverty and achieving gender equality falls significantly short. We need to increase the rate by 26 times to reach the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030. This data underscores the urgent need for collective action to ensure a future where all women and girls have equal opportunities and rights.

The Flood Disaster

Yes, God-sent. When no one could reach some places for help, not even the government, your support allowed us to reach those places. We found over 350 families stuck, hungry, and thirsty, praying for someone to come with water, food, and basic necessities. Your support answered their prayers.

Food for Life Vrindavan not only provided these families with food rations and basic needs but also organized medical camps once the water settled down. We continued supporting all the families as much as possible. These families lost everything in the floods—household furniture, electrical equipment, even their rickshaws which were a means of livelihood for many. With your support, all the families have been rehabilitated with new furniture, and we continue to provide them with monthly rations.

For a girl from an underprivileged family, getting a good education is in itself can be a challenging task. However, when such a girl achieves a hundred percent attendance in her school, it is truly remarkable.

These girls often face financial and societal barriers to education, but our school girl Parul has demonstrated her commitment to her education with her 100% attendance.



Remarkable Remembrance

Venupriya, an 11-year-old student in the 4th grade at Sandipani Muni School, has achieved an incredible feat: she has memorized all 700 verses from the 18 chapters of the Srimad Bhagavad Gita.

Her father works as a temple servant to provide for their family of four.

Despite her circumstances, Venupriya excels in her studies and consistently wins various competitions.

Venupriya's journey is a shining example of what young talents from underprivileged backgrounds can achieve with the right support and opportunities.




"The girl who topped the district"

Her success is not personal but it's a triumph for all underprivileged children.



Child marriage remains a pervasive threat, FFLV with your support keeps a girl in school where she not only receives food, clothing, transport, medication and education but also the protection through our child protection team from getting married underage.

After school, she dedicates her entire day to studying and showcasing the transformative power of education in her life. New Year Gift Festival 2024



Achievements since 1991

RATION EDUCATION FREE MEALS MONTHLY RENT UNIVERSITY MEDICAL

- Distribution of free monthly ration over **39,215** times to help over **8125** poor families in the last 18 years.
- Free quality education to over 3600 girls in 3 schools in the last 23 years.
- Served over 26.2 million free meals to the underprivileged since 1991
- Free monthly rent over 7412 times to help over 382 needy families with their accommodation in the last 18 years
- Supported 402 girls in completing their university in the last 11 years.
- Free medical assistance over 496 times from free health checkups to Intensive care unit treatments.



THE SILENT STRUGGLE

In India, women shoulder a staggering 5 hours daily of unpaid care work, while men contribute less than an hour. The toll extends beyond economics; it manifests as heightened stress and compromised well-being. Urgent reforms are needed to recognize, redistribute, and value women's unpaid contributions, fostering a more equitable society.



Educate Girls/Send them to School

Ours educate a girl program offers a real opportunity for the poorest girls to improve their lives. Sponsors' contributions of Rs.3,500 (US\$ 45) per month enable these girls to attend our Sandipani Muni Schools and receive an education. This amount provides nutritious meals, school supplies, books, uniforms and medical care.

FFLV University Education

Every year we have girls who graduate from the 12th standard who wish to continue their studies. The donation amount includes college uniforms. stationerv books. sometimes transportation at INR 3,600 (\$45) per month
