Judy Holley Machine Quilting Class on March 7th

Judy Holley, GSQA Circuit teacher, will present an all day machine quilting class for our guild on March 7th.

CLASS DESCRIPTION:


An overview of various machine quilting techniques. Spend the morning straight-line quilting a small project from your stash, nothing special, one of those UFO's or some orphan blocks, stitched into a small quilt. After lunch experiment with various free motions techniques on a self-prepared muslin sandwich, approximately 30" square.

Supplies:

- Sewing machine in good working order with all attachments, instruction book & extension cord. Darning foot required for free motion work. Walking foot is optional.
- Basic sewing supplies
- Long Ruler for marking a grid
- Fabric marker of some kind (chalk, pencil, blue washout marker)
- Safety pins, 200-300
- Cotton batting, 80% cotton or 100%, either one
- Normal sewing thread, whatever you usually use

Fabrics:

Bring a small quilt, already sandwiched, to practice in the ditch & grid quilting, nothing special. Two orphaned blocks set with alternating plain squares, sashed and bordered, see diagram, are perfect.



To practice free motion work bring a prepared muslin sandwich at least 30" sq.
