First EVER Quarterly Sew& Draw

9AM till the pieced quilt top is completed - around 3 PM-ish)
Remember to bring a bag lunch and drink or plan on running out to Subway.

FROM MELBA (aka The Wench Master):

Eleven (11) cutting, ironing and sewing wenches signed up for this first session. You may still join our group even if you did not sign up and decide to come at the last minute.

If we each bring the equivalent of <u>1 yard (F.Q.'s/scraps) fabric</u> we should be able to produce a nice size quilt (King size is what we are shooting for).

Supply List:

- 1. One (1) yard pre-washed fabric (can be F.Q.'s or scraps but equal to approximately 1 yard fabric)
- 2. Neutral thread (sewing wenches only)
- 3. 6-1/2" square (cutting wenches only)
- 4. Larger square for squaring up blocks (cutting wenches only)
- 5. Spray starch/water spray bottle (ironing wenches only)

Everyone signed up to bring a sewing machine; cutting mat & rotary cutter; and iron and board/pad SO this is what we will do......If you want to sew, bring a machine; if you want to cut, bring a mat & rotary cutter; if you want to iron, bring an iron and pad/board. I am sure we will have a perfect amount of each.

The ones bringing machines should also bring extension cords.



Of Interest:

NOTAN: a Japanese design concept involving the play and placement of light and dark next to the other in art and imagery. This use of light and dark translates shape and form into flat shapes on a two-dimensional surface.





Helpful hints from All About Quilting and Design - http://www.aaquilting.com/tips.html:

- 1. To find the value of a color (light, medium, or dark), try viewing through a clear piece of red glass or plastic. Another good method is to cut small squares of fabrics and photocopy them. Either way... instant values without the distraction of colors.
- 2. Purchase a door peep-hole from the hardware store and use at quilt shows or at home when you can't stand back far enough. You'll be able to stand up close and see the whole quilt which is really helpful when you are arranging pieces on a design board or pinning onto a sheet. Also, you will be amazed at some of the secondary patterns that emerge.
- 3. Take a photograph(s) when you are looking for or have found the "perfect" arrangement for quilt blocks. Seeing the whole quilt at once may help you decide if you like the arrangement or put a block in the "wrong" place. Later you can check your final photo if you get mixed up when sewing the blocks together. If you've tried several arrangements and have photos of each, you can compare to see what you prefer.
