Program for March 28, 2013: Mariner's Compass and Primitive Patchwork

Intimidated by the complexity of the Mariner's Compass? Believe that only geometry goddesses (or gods) can wrap their minds and protractors around the mysteries of this stunning traditional block pattern? Fear not—in this month's program, Gloria will guide us through an easy paper-folding method of drafting the Mariner's Compass using only the simplest of tools (no PhD in mathematics, CAD programs or slide rules necessary). Then Joy will take us through the steps of making Ricky Tims' Primitive Patchwork blocks. These two simple blocks are a great project for beginners to learn and practice basic strip-piecing and block assembly techniques without the demand for pinpoint accuracy in cutting and matching seams. So you can relax and just have fun playing with colors and fabrics!

MATERIALS NEEDED

Mariner's Compass:

Pencil (mechanical is best or bring a sharpener)

Straight edge/ruler

Eraser

Paper scissors

Primitive Patchwork:

Amounts needed depend on the size of the quilt you decide to make. Strips may be 22 inches long (so fat quarters can be used), but you will obviously need more of the shorter strips than you would of strips using the full width of fabric (WOF). The amounts given here are those you will need if you would like to sew sample blocks at the program meeting.

2 ½ inch strips of a variety of fabrics of your choice (Ricky specifies solids or blended solids) - minimum of 4 (either 22" or WOF)

3 inch strips of darker (or could be brighter as long as it contrasts with the four fabrics above) fabric - minimum of 1 (WOF) or 2 (if 22" strips)

5 ½ inch strips of lighter fabric -
minimum of 1 (WOF) or 2
(if 22" strips)

5 ½ inch strips of darker fabric -
minimum of 1 (WOF) or 2
(if 22" strips)
