The pattern was Shuttered, a freebie from the Fat Quarter Shop, using Mardi Gras colors with a white background. Michele brought the background fabric. Members brought 2 fat quarters of Mardi Gras fabric to the Sew'N Draw meeting. If people already had some 10" squares cut in the Mardi Gras colors or patterns, they could bring them. Michele brought her go cutter to cut 10" squares.

February Program Meeting

The Program Meeting was held February 22nd to work on the 2025 Opportunity Quilt. Nineteen members and three visitors came and worked on portions of the Opportunity Quilt as directed by Chair April H. Members brought sewing machines, cutting items, and ironing items.

Kay G worked on the Drunkard's Path Magnolia block with Martha S. Kay drafted the pattern for the Magnolia in a program called Electric Quilt 8 or EQ8 from a Pinterest image that April H provided. As of February 26, 2025, all hundred 3 1/2" blocks are completed, but the final magnolias need to be put together.



Marsha R was the team leader for the bird blocks. She used a bird pattern she already had. She brought instructions and cut fabric pieces. Michele M, Therese S, and Jill W sewed bird blocks in sections.

April H was the team leader for the Convergence Blocks – design from a Ricky Tim book. She brought completed samples to show as well as the 9-inch squares to use to create the final blocks.



Four 9-inch square blocks were sewn together - 2 light colored and 2 dark colored. See below.




Then strips were cut from the new block using a width pattern.




Cutting the First Pattern by Widths 3" 2-1/2" 2" 1-1/2"

The strips are then arranged by color and strip width to form a new pattern to be sewn together.



Set the Pattern from the Four 9-Inch Blocks 3" 1.5" 2.5" 2" 2" 2.5" 1.5" 3"



Completed New Block

This new block is then cut into strips and arranged by color and strip width into the final convergence pattern.

At the end of the Program Meeting most of the convergence, magnolia, and bird blocks were completed!

At the March Business Meeting, April said that thirteen convergence blocks still needed to be completed for the Opportunity Quilt as well as its final completion. It was suggested that a Sit 'N Sew Meeting be called in order to work together on the quilt again.

Quilt Show Director for 2025 Quilt Show

Sue C is our Quilt Show Director for the Guild's 2025 Quilt Show. Sue is maintaining a sign-up sheet for various Quilt Show tasks. Many members have volunteered, but some jobs remain open. Volunteers are still needed for constructing the quilt (see above). Sue asked if anyone could recommend a quilter. Would someone please consider volunteering to quilt our Opportunity Quilt?

Sue is particularly interested in finding a small team of members to coordinate remote sales of Opportunity Quilt tickets. We need people to manage selling tickets at venues like Second Saturday, GSQA meetings, Arts Alive, and other local festivals and events. They will sign up members in advance to show up and sell tickets, transport the quilt, rack, canopy, table, tickets, seed money, etc., and deliver each event's proceeds to the treasurer.

Calendar Quilt Block

Each month a quilter will make a block that **reflects the month of the Business Meeting**. The block size, pattern, fabric, etc. is chosen by the quilter. The 12block quilt must be completed for the 2025 Quilt Show. Sue C will arrange an area for Viewer's Choice on the Calendar Quilts.

UFOs (Unfinished Objects)

April H is our UFO master. Projects **must** be started to qualify, but guild projects and Sew'N Draws from 2024 can be added. As members present their Show and Tell quilts/projects, April checks off any quilt/project on the member's UFO list. Members who complete UFO quilts/projects will be entered for a prize in a drawing at the Christmas party.

Hospitality Chairperson

Judy F is the Hospitality Chairperson for this year.

GSQA Traveling Teacher Coordinator

Kay G has graciously volunteered to replace Marsha R as the Coordinator for upcoming GSQA traveling teacher classes. Thank you, Kay, for volunteering for this important position that gives our members more opportunities to learn new things in the quilt world!

April H related that GSQA is bringing Cindy Grisdela back in **April 2025** to teach the classes she missed because of illness. The scheduled dates are April 13th through 19th. Once we have more details, Kay will circulate a sign-up sheet to see who remains interested in the class.

March Program Meeting

The Program Meeting on March 28th will be led by Jasmine of Peace by Piece to present a program on a 10 degree ruler. She will demo using the ruler to make a table runner, quilt borders, and a Christmas tree skirt.

Supply List - 3 fat eighths or 3 fat quarters, 10 degree ruler, sewing machine, and basic sewing kit.

Jasmine will have fabric bundles and the 10 degree ruler available for purchase at the meeting. Cost for the ruler is approximately \$30. You must have a ruler to make the table runner. Here are the samples of the table runners:



Table Runners Using 10 Degree Ruler

Jasmine said that 3 fat quarters would make both table runners. Same amount of fabric for each of them...just one is curvy and one is straight.

St. Joseph Abbey Retreat

As always, the food was great and everyone was working on several projects. May Program Meeting

The Program Meeting on May 23rd will be a Slash the Stash led by Ida M. Bring scraps from your stash to share as we sew a table runner. The largest piece is 6-1/2" x 8". The next largest piece is 2-1/2" by 10". We'll "shop" from each other's stash with the caveat that everything we take must be used at the program meeting. Each participant will also need ten or eleven 1" WOF strips for sashing.


