Guild Projects for 2013

Please bring ideas for projects to the business meeting. Leaders for the projects are also needed. The better the mix of people and ideas, the more stimulating and exciting our quilting experience. You don't have to be an expert – just be willing to organize, read up on a topic, and present something that caught your attention that you think other quilters will also enjoy.

<u>Program Night – Basic Quilting Skills Demonstrations – June 27, 2013</u>

The June 27 program meeting will be mini demonstrations and samples for basic quilting skills.

Lou Ada will demonstrate hand piecing with all/some of those tips and hints she has learned. If you would like to follow along, some **small scraps**, a **needle and thread**, and other hand sewing notions can be brought to the meeting.

Kay Guillot will show us some of her tips on accurate cutting with the rotary cutter and mat. If the cutting is not good, the quilting piece will show it. Joy will show us some hand quilting tips like she uses on her mini quilts, again if you want some practice, bring <u>a small quilt sandwich, needle, and thread</u>. A thimble is also recommended.

Joan will show us how to determine a good 1/4 inch seam on our machine. You can always cut larger and trim but that takes more time.

The meeting room will be set up with 4 stations that you can rotate around and find a small group so that you can ask questions and see and hear well. If you want to repeat in one or more of the stations, that will be your choice also. We should have ample time to see all the demonstrations and practice a little if wanted. Be sure to bring any questions you have so you can profit from the learning experiences of the longer time quilters. I expect we will have some mini handouts for reminders for you also.
