An original design paper doll machine appliqué class by Gloria Burlette

You will need:

1.Sewing machine in good order with free motion (darning foot) and embroidery foot or appliqué foot. Please know your machine and bring your usual sewing kit.

- 2. Embroidery or sharp needles size 11 or 14.
- 3. A couple of fat quarters of contrasting colors that are solid or read solid plus light beige or skin color as you choose and small pieces of fabric for your hat and clothes. The extra base fabric will be used to practice your stitching before working on Suzette.
- 4. Fusible web such as Steam a Seam, Wonder Under, etc. Make sure it's a sewing product not craft. You will only need one sheet 8 ½ by 11.
- 5. Regular thread in your chosen skin color and also thread to match your clothes. You can also bring decorative thread, metallic with a metallic needle, monofilament thread and heavy thread for bobbin work.
- 6. After you design her clothes you can cut Suzette apart to use as a pattern. Cut exactly on the line and you will have legs, body, arms/back and hat. You will need to make your own pattern for her clothes and will use tracing paper for that.
- 7. Bring stabilizer for your amount of base fabric.
- 8. Bring permanent markers, pencil and eraser, paper scissor.

Pre-class instructions:

Cut 11"x11" out of one of the fat quarters as a base for Suzette, I suggest the darkest one.

Cut your Steam a Seam in half lengthwise reserving one piece for Suzette. If you have never used fusible web then you might want to wait for the class to go any further.

If you are familiar with fusible then remove the paper backing on one half and fuse it to the fabric left over from cutting the base square. You will be given a design to cut for a practice piece for your stitches.
