Program Night—July 28

This month we have a two-fold project plan. Mary Beth D volunteered to teach us how to enlarge a photo/pattern. Most of you remember her wonderful "Green Eggs and Ham" wall hanging she showed us. Now is your chance to learn how she did it. We'll start Thursday night, July 28th with enlarging a photo/pattern and then Saturday, July 30th she will help you with the applique/piecing. Saturday we will meet at the Kiln Library at 9:00 am with the class starting at 9:30. Bring a bag lunch and a trash bag for your threads etc.

The idea of this project night is to help people get a start on making a quilt for the Hancock Library Charity Book Quilt Auction.

Here is the supply list for July 28th Thursday night's how to enlarge a picture by drawing grids class.

Copy the image straight from the book to regular printer paper. If the book is larger than 8 $1/2 \times 11$ then take multiple copies from opposite sides of the page and tape them together to recreate the image.

18" by 24" piece of freezer paper or at least as big as the finished size of quilt you want to make. Mary Beth will have some spare sheets of freezer paper for 50 cents if you forget.

sharp Pencil

12" regular school ruler

6x24 gridded quilting ruler or similar size

Supplies for the July 30th Saturday applique class for making the book quilt top. The book, the copy of the page and the finished grid drawing of the image on freezer paper (and depending on the complexity of the image you may want to make a copy of your freezer paper drawing).

Basic Sewing Supplies (machine, scissors, seam ripper, pins, etc)

2 yards of Steam-a-seam 2, or Wonder under or any double sided fusible interfacing.

A piece of background fabric 4 inches larger than the finished size of the quilt you want to make.

Scrap fabrics big enough for all the applique pieces you want to make for this image.

Thread - all colors of cotton or embroidery thread to match your scrap fabrics for machine applique. fabric glue stick

applique pressing sheet if you have one

Ironing board and irons

The quilting of the quilt top will be done as desired after the class.

Brief Artist Bio:

J. Marcus Weekley began quilting in 2000 with his mother, Violet Newby, who taught him numerous sewing skills before he actually attempted to make a quilt on his own in 2003-2004. Since then, Marcus has developed a unique voice in quilting: predominantly original designs, some echoing traditional patterns, each conveying contemporary, personal messages through fabrics and threads. His quilts have shown in international, national, and local exhibits at venues ranging from The National Quilt Museum in Paducah, KY to The Festival of Quilts in Birmingham, UK to The Bay Oaks Guild Show at St. Rose de Lima Church in Bay

St. Louis, MS. Marcus also works as a college English teacher, a story-teller (poet, fiction writer, and screenwriter), and a photographer. Marcus has lived in coastal Mississippi off and on over the past eighteen years, and he currently resides in Gulfport.
