Next Sew and Draw is September 21st at the Kiln Library. Here's how Sew & Draw works for the benefit of our newest members: Members sign up for various duties such as ironing, cutting and sewing and as a team we make a pieced quilt top in a day. For every session attended the member's name goes into a hat that many times for a drawing of a lucky winner of that quilt top.

This quilt top will be blue, white and yellow and we will be more selective about the fabrics brought in (scraps, fat quarters or yardage, whatever you want to contribute). The blues should be true blues, no blue-greens, in light, medium and dark. Same with the yellows, true yellows with no limes or orangey yellows, in light and medium. Melba LaCaze will provide the white fabric.

You may bring lunch or go to Subway (just up the road). Come one, come all for a fun time and a chance to win a quilt! (But remember, past winners are not eligible for the drawing but should come to help and have fun!)
