Just to remind you, we are required to use some of each fabric plus up to two additional fabrics in the challenge quilt. There is no size or theme restriction for this quilt. The quilt top should be completed by the January 21, 2010 meeting. Our program that night will be a discussion of possible ways to quilt each top.

Solveig to Teach Easy Stained Glass Technique at October 22nd Meeting

At the October 22nd meeting Solveig will teach the Stained Glass effect. She will also demonstrate how to make your own "bias" strips for the leading at the October 8th business meeting, so you can make your own for

next to no cost! (Note: all the lines in this project are straight, so the strips can be made from the straight of grain and do not need to be real bias strips.)

Supplies and materials:

- 9 1/2 " square up ruler is best, if you have a bigger one, that will work as well
- Rotary cutter, mat
- 12" long skinnier ruler, to draw and cut lines
- Iron and pressing surface
- Sewing machine with straight stitch and zig zag capability
- 8 1/2 inch square cardboard or stiff paper
- Paper scissors
- Pen/pencil
- At least 9 (I used 12 or more) 8 3/4" squares of colors that play well together (light, bright, a few darker)

- Muslin, old sheeting, or fabric you hate (it will be covered up) cut into 9 (nine) 9 inch squares. Allows for shrinkage as you sew.
- About a yard of black or quite dark fabric for sashing, borders, and "bias" strips if you choose to make your own
- If you purchase bias binding for the "leading" you will need about 1 yard per square. Should be 1/4 to 1/2 inch wide, not wider. Binding choices are up to the individual
- Thread to zigzag the pieces into place on the foundation and to match the leading (could be invisible thread) In class we will probably only be able to complete 2 or 3 squares, but once you get into the swing, it goes very fast.
 - Solveig reports she made her sample in two days, which I'm sure surprises none of us.

Judy Holley Class Scheduled for November 7th



On November 7th Judy Holley, GSQA Circuit teacher, will present her New York Beauties II class to the Bay Oaks guild. In this class, which is appropriate for beginning as well as experienced quilters, we will learn how to make a variety of New York Beauty blocks with various sized points and arcs. Mix and match the 8-inch blocks or choose a favorite and work with it. All points are paper pieced and all curves are sewn, no appliqué. Bay Oaks members who are also GSQA members pay \$10, and members who are not GSQA members pay \$15 for the class. The guild will pay the other half of the class fee for each of our members. Please be prepared to pay Therese when you sign up as she must send in the money a week prior to class.
