Supply List for Foundation Paper Piecing Class

March 23, 2023

A kit containing the paper foundation pattern and all precut fabrics will be provided in class. You can work on the project in class or take notes in class and practice with the kit at home.

I will bring an ironing board and iron as well as scotch tape.

If sewing, you should to bring:

- Sewing machine in good working order with a sharp needle, preferable #14 or #16.
- Neutral thread in needle and bobbin
- Paper scissors
- Fabric scissors
- 45mm rotary cutter and small mat (I will have a couple mats available)
- Add-a-Quarter ruler, 6" or 12" (If you don't have one, you can probably borrow one from your neighbor for the few times it will be used in class)
- Index card or postcard or a piece of template plastic 2" wide and as long as your ruler
- Glue stick or glue pen
- Pencil or pen
