Table Runner - Krista Moser Pattern

The Program Meeting was held on August 27th. Marsha demonstrated the steps to make a table runner from a Krista Moser pattern. The Krista Moser instructions were given out beforehand to members when it was a free download. Now the pattern must be purchased.

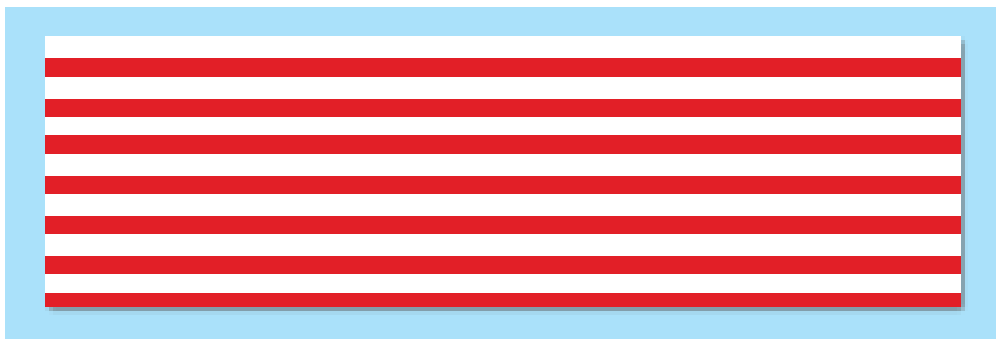


During the Meeting:

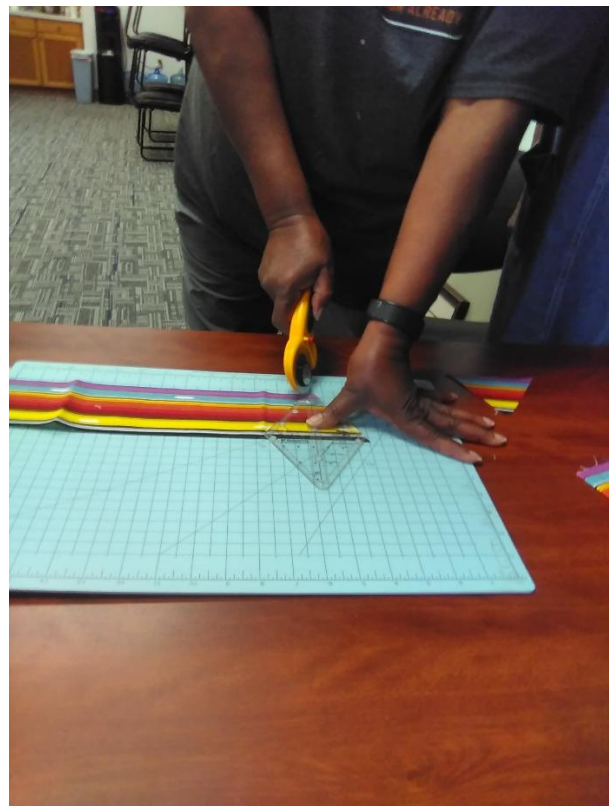
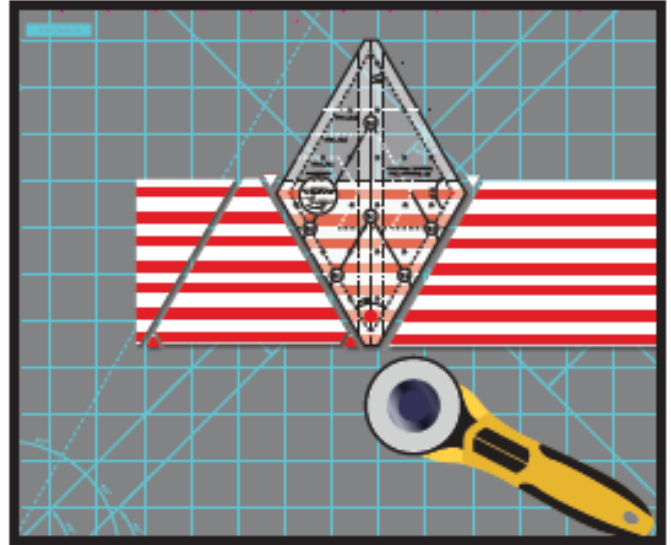
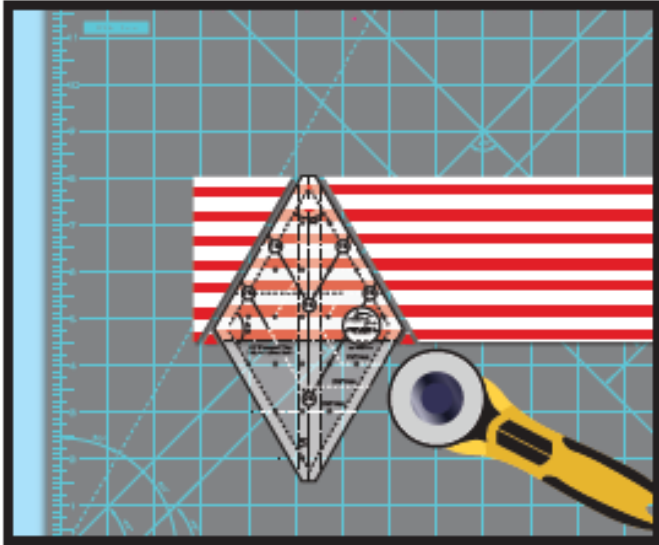
1. Using the 60 degrees Tiny ruler, cut eighteen 3-1/2 inch diamonds from the feature fabric. Center the main motif so it shows well within the diamond.



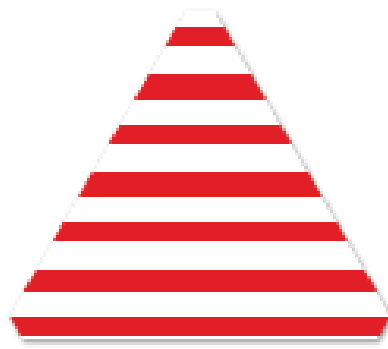
2. From the background stripe fabric, cut 3-1/2-inch-wide strips, ensuring the stripe runs along the length of the strip. You will want to start your measurement from the same point on each.



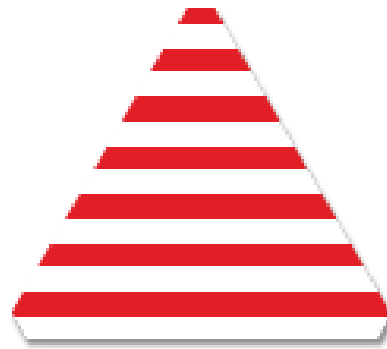
3. Using the 60° Tiny ruler, align the 3-1/2 inch triangle line on the bottom of a strip, with the flat tip of the ruler at the top. Cut on both sides of the ruler, then rotate the ruler 180° to make the next cut.



4. From each strip, you'll get two kinds of triangles, top cuts and bottom cuts. The stripes will appear differently on these two kinds of triangles. Match up twelve top cuts or twelve bottom cuts for each hexagon. You will need a total of 36 triangles for the whole runner.

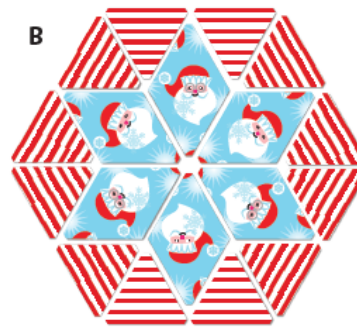
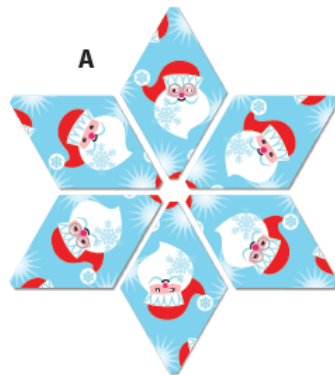


Top Cut

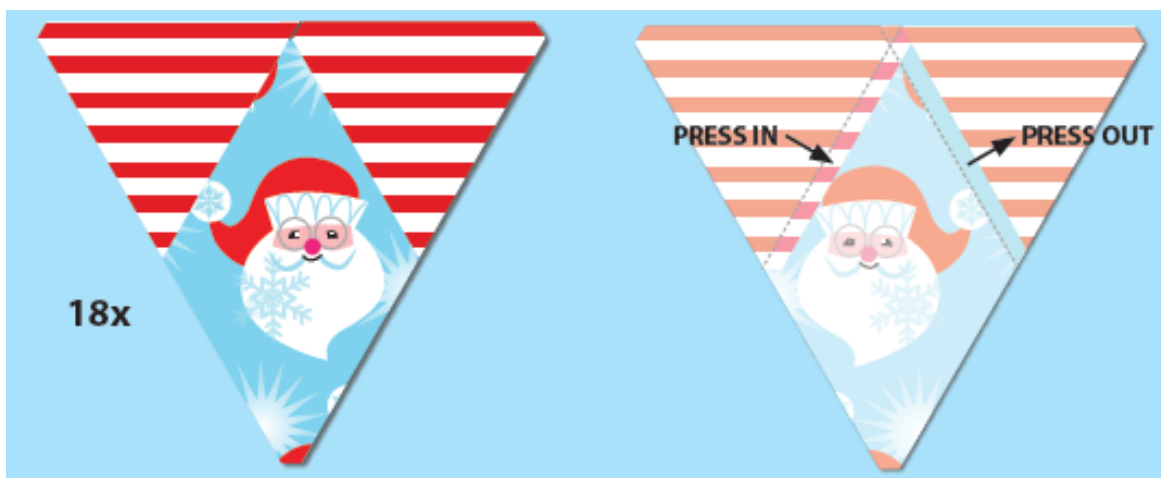


Bottom Cut

5. For each block, lay out six fussy cut diamonds into a star pattern (A). Use twelve matching striped triangles to fill in the areas around the star (B).

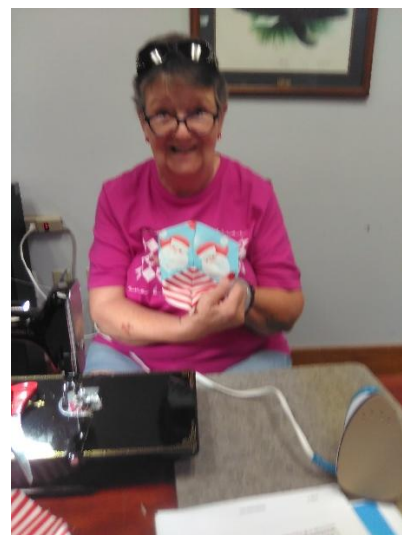
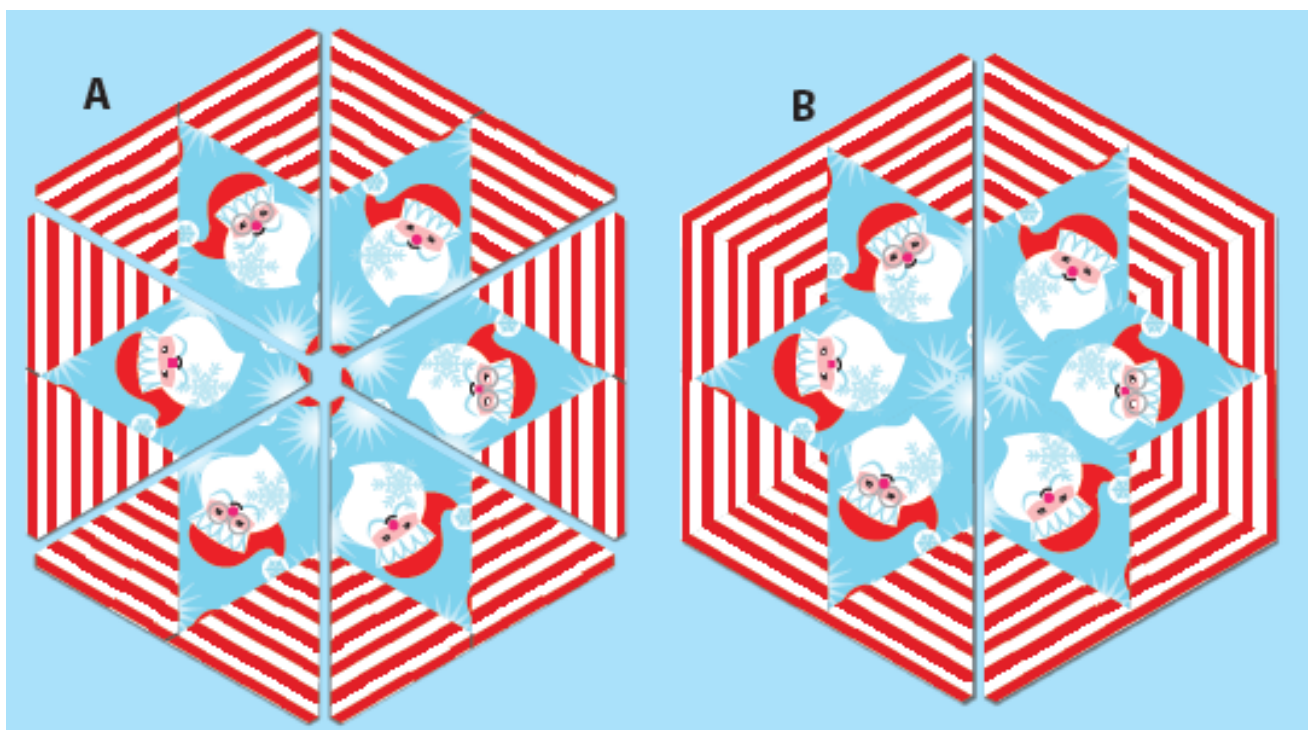


6. Sew one of the striped triangles to the top right of the diamond: Press that seam in towards the diamond. Sew the second striped triangle to the top left of the diamond, and press that seam out toward the striped triangle. Make six larger triangle units like this for each block, for a total of 18 larger triangle units.



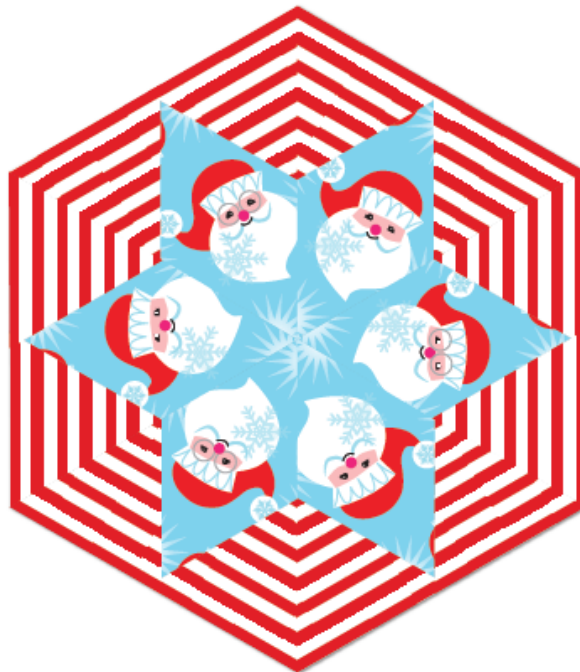


7. Arrange six units for one block as shown (A). Sew them together into two halves. Sew the first two triangle units together, and press that seam open before sewing the third triangle on (B). Press that seam open.



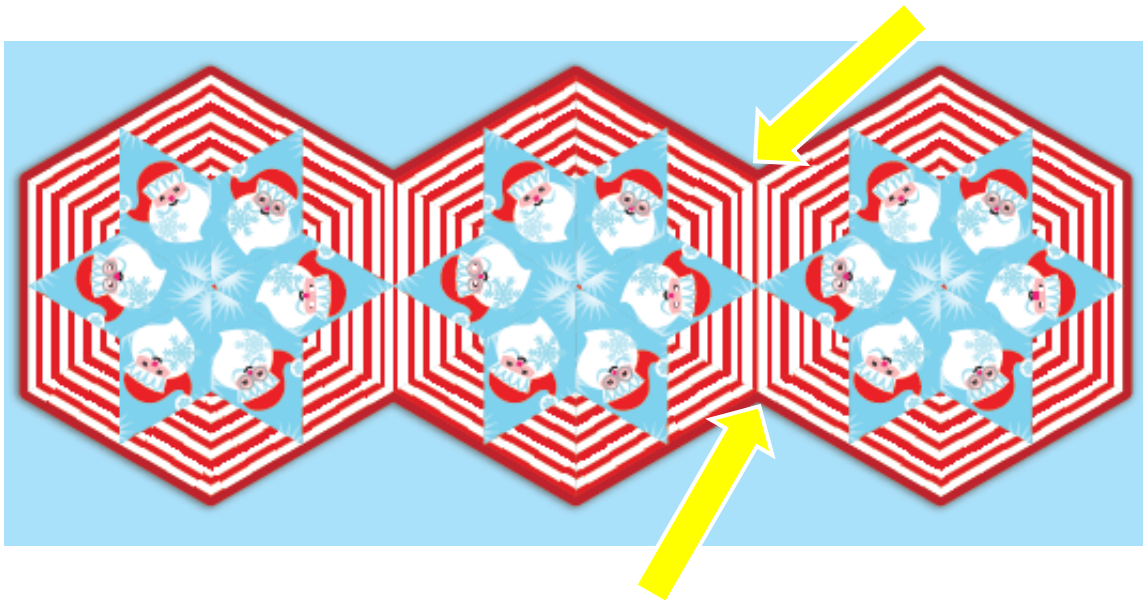


8. Finally, sew the seam up the middle to join the two halves and press that seam open.





9. Sew the three hexagons to each other in a row along one of the flat edges. Leave unsewn $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from the top and bottom when you sew the hexagons together. This makes it easier to sew on the binding.



10. Cut three $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from fabric you want for the binding. Sew binding.
