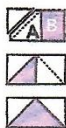
ABOUT THIS SERIES QUILT

Warmth of Our Stars is a series quilt presented in six parts. Part One appeared in *Love of Quilting's* January/February 2021 issue, and included materials and cutting instructions for all six parts. In Part Two you'll add some bright-colored Flying Geese to Part One's center star to make the dynamic center section. Part One also included instructions for making the center star (block V).

FLYING GEESE ASSEMBLY

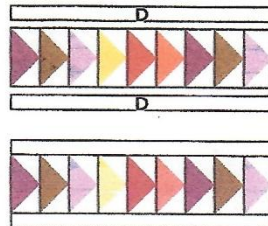
Use an accurate ¼" seam allowance throughout to ensure all elements of the quilt fit together well. To achieve Scott's scrappy look, randomly select assorted color patches.

- Place white tonal A on assorted color B, right sides facing. Sew diagonally as shown in *Diagram V*. Trim ¼" beyond stitching as shown. Press open. Repeat on opposite end of assorted B to complete Flying Geese 1. Make 36 total.



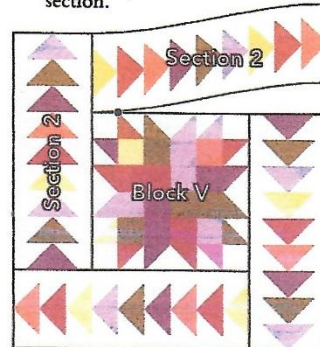
Flying Geese 1

- Referring to *Diagram VI*, join 9 Flying Geese 1's and 2 white D's as shown to complete section 2. Make 4 total.

- Lay out block V and 4 section 2's as shown in *Diagram VII*. Referring to *Partial Seams* in *Sew Easy Lessons*, and working counterclockwise, join sections to block V to complete center section.

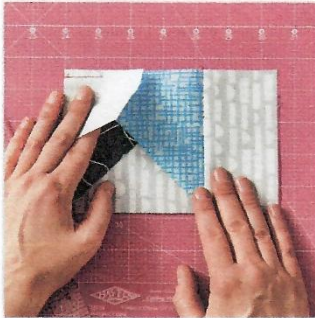
This shows you how to do a partial seam.

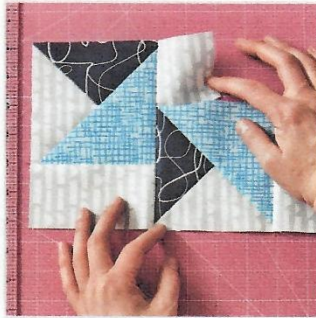
Partial Seams

no, you do not make this block!

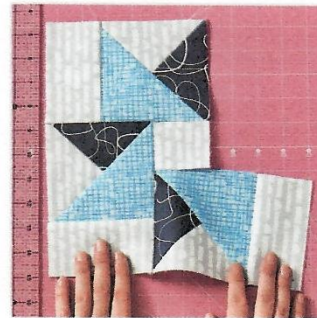
Some traditional blocks use this method to join patches and units around a central square.



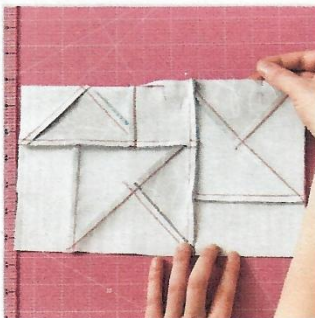
1. With right sides together, align corner edges of square and first unit as shown. Sew from center of square to left edge, creating a partial seam.



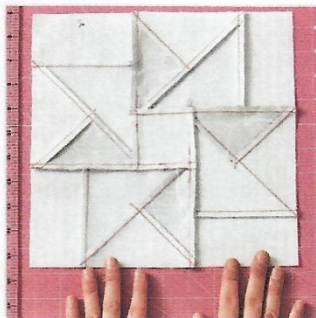
2. Working clockwise, join second unit, sewing entire length of seam. Press away from square.



3. In same manner, join third unit.



4. To join fourth unit, fold block over to align edges of fourth unit with square and first unit, pinning in place.



5. Finish by sewing from partial seam to outside edge of block.



6. Press seam allowance away from center square to complete block.
