June Business Meeting

The June business meeting was held on Thursday, June 8, 2023, at 1:00 pm at the Kiln Library with 20 members including 1 new member in attendance.

May Program Meeting

Our Program Meeting was held on May 25th at the Kiln Library with 14 members and 2 guests in attendance. Ida M. led the members in making Red, White, and Blue Four Patch 5 inch Coasters for the GSQA July Meeting. She had previously sent out an email to members with a youtube link showing how to make the Folded Fabric Coasters. Some members made coasters ahead of time. Other members had plenty of 5 inch fabric squares and 5 inch batting squares cut ready to be pressed and assembled. Members needed 6 five inch squares for each coaster. The reason for the extra square was that it was needed in order to put batting between two full squares at the bottom of the coaster to absorb condensation when needed. We made 125 squares. Ida will take more coasters if members make them. Any extras could go to the veterans' home. Chris J. was cutting 5 inch squares. Other members brought 5 inch squares with them. Debbie L. was ironing fabric and squares. Others ironed also. It looked like an assembly line from placing pieces together, sewing the coasters, clipping corners, and inverting the material to new coasters.

The Lotto "block" for July is in the shape of an equilateral triangle using 1 inch strips. Only a triangle. The challenge is to use shades from light to dark in the same hue with the center triangle in a contrasting color. The finished triangle should have an internal triangle size of 2 ½ inches. Sew N Draw was on June 17, 2023. Ten members attended. Michele M. chose the pattern Jewel Box by Donna Jordan with a black background. The finished guilt top would be 52 inches by 52 inches. The website: https://jordanfabrics.com/ and click on free patterns. Michele had members bring 3 fat quarters that were jewel tone colored batiks to the Sew and Draw. She provided the black fabric. Stations were set up for members for their sewing machines, for irons and ironing surfaces, and for members that brought tools to cut fabric and assemble the pieces together to form the quilt top pattern. Sue L. won the quilt top from the drawing of the ten names. She was given leftover fabric and cut fabric squares that she could use to add to the quilt top as she wished.
