### Charity Quilts — Louise H — Absent

Florence P received thank you notes from the Friends of the Animal Shelter for kennel pads donated and from the staff of the library thanking us for our participation in the annual tree display at Christmas. The guild also received an invitation to a fund raiser for the Food Pantry to take place June 26<sup>th</sup> at the Bay Waveland Yacht Club (\$50.00 per person) for those interested in attending.

Sharon B also stated that some of the Ladies involved in the quilt donations to North Carolina will be coming to a program meeting.

There are 4 quilts to be donated to the librarians by year end that some members are completing. Also, the library has a support group that meets at the library and asked if the guild could donate some fidget quilts to them. Louise H does have a Saturday in October scheduled with the library to work on donation quilts.

### Old Business

Quilt Show Recap — Sue C, quilt show Chair, thanked everyone for doing their jobs to make the show successful. Sharon B completed the financial recap and is available for review upon request.

Calendar Quilt Challenge Winners were awarded cash prizes determined by the membership and presented at the meeting.

Ida M asked why some quilts were folded and displayed on racks rather than hung. Therese S explained that there was more than the normal number of large quilts which took up the display space but added that if the quilt was essentially the same block/pattern throughout and was a smaller quilt that it was put on a rack. Therese also stated that there is a limited amount of room to hang everything and that we only have so many hanging racks.

There were yo-yos attached to clothespins for attendees at the show to grasp to look at the back of the quilt without touching it which is a great idea to incorporate into the next show.

Kathy K decided that when some of the smaller quilt racks were disassembled, they were zip tied together so next time there will be less confusion piecing them together. She offered to check for missing or broken pieces as well.

Door prizes were discussed as to the quantity and the method of awarding. After much discussion it was decided to stay with the method of awarding by ticket number but that maybe the guild should have more. Toward the end of the show boutique items were used.

Martha S said the boutique was well received thanks to all donations of fabric and craft items.

April H felt it would be a good idea for everyone to notate what they did during the show, what worked and what did not and keep it for future reference. Kay G agreed and mentioned that it is an After-Action report. More discussion on this to come.

Florence P asked members to think about a theme for the next quilt show and stated that the guild needs to think about who will chair it and who would design the quilt or whether members choose a design. By July or so of next year (2026) the quilt should be made for the 2027 Show.

## New Business:

Beckwith Retreat — Therese S announced the retreat was opened to others as the guild needed 20 attendees for the meals to be included. As of the meeting the count was at 19. Members can reach out to friends etc.

Sew'N Draw rescheduled for June 7<sup>th</sup> was cancelled due to low participation per Michelle M. She stressed the importance of having at least 10-12 members attend because at the last one the winner went home with a top to be stitched rather than being stitched at the program. Michelle was absent from the meeting today but can address it at the next meeting.

## Challenges

Florence P presented the idea of a fabric draw each month at the meeting where members would receive a ticket for perhaps each fat quarter brought in and the winner receives all the fat quarters.

There was little interest for that so she moved on to a different challenge known as quilt in a box or a round robin. April H offered to gather information on it and guild members did not object to it starting in one year and completed the next year. So September is the possible start date after all information is received.

### Door Prizes for Business Meetings

It was decided that the guild would buy the door prizes for the monthly business meetings not to exceed a value of \$20.00 and that the Board would decide who would be responsible for obtaining them. One of the door prizes suggested under the \$20.00 limit could be a free membership. A motion was made by April H and seconded by Ida M. Motion carried.
