Donation Quilts for CASA on Coast: Liz has 9 quilts she is holding until CASA meets again in September. Martha S has one quilt she will hold until Liz is ready to deliver them to CASA.

Board agreed that Guild members may make generic pillowcases for Woodland Village for Christmas 2026. Guild needs approximately 120 pillowcases for Woodland Village. Members need to finish strip quilts for CASA. Members can continue to make pillowcases, fidget lap quilts and kennel pads at home to turn in for donation. We have 35. We need 85 more.

It was suggested that members make pillowcases at home and bring them to the meetings. There was a suggestion to book a Saturday to have a Charity Sew again. It was decided to use a Program Meeting – possible October - to work on pillowcases. Information on materials needed and their cut sizes will be going out to members. Members can have their material precut and ready to sew. Material can also be swapped for different combinations.

Beckwith Retreat, August 13-16, 2026 – Therese S

The 2026 Beckwith Retreat dates are August 13th through 16th. Campers can arrive on

The cost for the Retreat is \$357 for a double room and \$435 for a single room. Members may
wish to make payments in thirds - \$119 for 3 payments per person for a double occupancy room
and \$145 for 3 payments per person for a single occupancy room which includes 2 meals
Thursday and Sunday; and 3 meals Friday and Saturday. The Retreat is now open to other
Guilds. There is a minimum of 20 people.
