October Business Meeting

The October Business Meeting was held on Thursday, October 10, 2024, at 1:04 pm at the Kiln Library with 17 members in attendance.

Each year the Guild elects a new Board. A Nominating Committee is formed of three Guild members who search for members to fill the vacant Board positions. Jean G discussed the need for three Guild members to volunteer to be the Nominating Committee for the 2025 officers. Therese S, Liz F, and Kay G volunteered.

Elected officers are President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Charity Donation Chair. Appointed (by the Board) positions are Membership, Newsletter Editor/Webmaster, and Quilt Show Chair. No officer shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive terms under our current bylaws.

Sherrie, Sharon, Louise, and Debbie all volunteered to serve in their posts again in 2025. Liz F volunteered to serve as Secretary for 2025. So the Nominating Committee will look for a President and a Vice-President.

Ticket Sales

Chris J, who is organizing locations for ticket sales, strongly feels that we should only display the opportunity quilt indoors. Her concern is that the center artwork is vulnerable to the elements, and should not be exposed to damp or rain. Chris needs at least four volunteers to sell tickets whenever the quilt is displayed at venues.

Chris checked on the Picayune 60th Festival on November 2nd-3rd. There would be a \$100 fee. Members decided not to pursue that venue. Chris mentioned displaying the quilt at the GSQA meeting on October 19th – no fee.

The members discussed attending and/or selling tickets and giving out bookmarks and postcards at the Murder at the Crazy Quilt Club play being presented

at the Village Lutheran Church in Lacombe, LA, the first and second weekends in October. There are Sunday matinees at 2:30 pm on October 6th & 13th. Sue R has made reservations for both Sunday performances for a table of 8 each day for the 2:30 pm show. Tables are first come, first serve. We should arrive at 2:00 pm in order to claim the table and set up the Opportunity Quilt. The quilt could be near our table. Reservations for the number of people may be changed. Please TEXT Sue R at 985-640-4737 (she is out of town) ASAP if you wish to go or suddenly can't go to the performance. A few members attended the October 6th performance and sold tickets. More members will attend the October 13th performance.

Sue R is corresponding with the Three Rivers Festival to be held on November 9th and 10th in Covington. It's a juried art event that takes over several city blocks. The booth fee is \$300, but we hope to negotiate that down. She has also emailed the Peter Anderson Festival in Ocean Springs, MS, for booth fee information.

October GSQA Quarterly Meeting

The October GSQA Meeting will be in Gulf Shores, AL, on October 19-20th. On Friday, October 19th, the Southern Fiber Artists (SFA) will teach a class on Felted Circles. Registration is via the GSQA website; a kit fee applies. The free presentation at the Saturday meeting is a fiber art display and a trunk show by the SFA. Make hotel reservations early because other Meetings are going on that weekend!

Gulf States Quilting Association will collect pillowcases for storm victims at the October 19th meeting in Gulf Shores. If you're not attending the GSQA meeting, you can give your pillowcases to Therese S, April H, or Susan V by October 16th.

The January, 2025, meeting will have Dianne Springer (Quilt on a Chair, Quilt on a Rug, Quilt on a Mailbox, etc).

October Program Meeting

The Program Meeting on October 24th will be a game of Quilt-O. Quilt-O (a quilt-related version of

bingo) is played with a buy-in of one 2 1/2" x WOF strip per card. Sharon B's husband will call the game. There will be a max of four cards per person per game, with a max of five games. So participants should bring (20) 2 1/2" WOF strips of good quality fabric and their own markers (buttons, beans, etc).

2024 Christmas Party

The Christmas Party will be on December 12, 2024, at the Kiln Library meeting room from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm. Everyone is asked to bring a covered dish or dessert. A sign-up sheet will be circulated a month before the party. We will once again have a Dirty Santa gift exchange of handmade items like last year, but with a slight adjustment to how tickets are handed out.

Calendar Quilt Block

Each month a quilter will make a block that **reflects the month of the Business Meeting**. The block size, pattern, fabric, etc. is chosen by the quilter. The 12-block quilt must be completed for the 2025 Quilt Show. Sue C will arrange an area for Viewer's Choice on the Calendar Quilts.

Charity Donation Chairperson

She also has a retirement home in Louisiana that wants any extra fidget quilts.

Marsha R collected quilts from members and sent them to a church in North Carolina for distribution to hurricane Helene victims. Ida M said she had shipping information if anyone else wants to send quilts.

Barbra S made crate quilts from fabric scraps for the Hancock Animal Shelter. The shelter has two sizes of cages. Quilts must be 24 inches by 24 inches or 24 inches by 48 inches and be washable. Jean G showed a pet crate quilt made by cutting up a commercial bed quilt and hemming the edges. Quick and Easy. All quilt donations would be appreciated.

Jean G led a discussion about the Guild making a monetary donation for Helene hurricane relief. As all the 2023 Quilt Show charities and amounts are already established and earmarked, additional charitable donations will come from the treasury. The Guild voted to make a donation of \$1,000 for hurricane Helene relief. Possible organizations were discussed. The Guild voted to give to Samaritan's Purse.

Hospitality Chairperson

Painting on Fabric

Having fun with paints and inks on fabric! This Class has a kit fee of \$35 which includes all paint needed for class and fabric squares with batting and backing.

We will create 3 blocks, using 3 types of paint. Several designs for you to choose from. Remember to bring an apron or old shirt, this is permanent and will not come out of your clothes.

The class will teach you how to apply the inks. How to blend and shadow your designs.

Types of paints and inks we will use are, Inktense Pencils, Liquid Ink, and Acrylic

THE KIT, Includes everything

- o Fabric
- o 3 designs
- o Brushes
- Ink- (liquid form)
- o Inktense Pencils and blocks
- o Acrylic paint
- Medium

You must bring your sewing machine and related items (thread, scissors.....)

A supply list will be sent out upon registration of class. You will be able to design all three blocks and have enough to take home and play on some of your

blocks.
