

Bay Oaks Quilt Guild Meeting

July 8, 2021

The meeting was called to order by Kathy at 6:30 p.m. at the Kiln Library with 17 members attending.

The June minutes had been emailed earlier in the month, Fay made a motion to accept the minutes and Gloria seconded the motion, all members agreed and the minutes were accepted.

Michele gave a treasurer's report since Marsha was unable to be at the meeting: 6/3/2021 balance-\$5618.29, 6/16/2021 deposit -\$3559.00, expense-ck#1345(cash for Beckwith overpayments)-\$24.00, 7/8/2021 balance-\$9153.29.

Old Business:

1. Kathy thanked Sharon for accepting the position of our Sew n' Draw person.
2. We still don't have anyone to be our historian or know where Rena kept the photo albums & folders.
3. Gloria collected the final payment for Beckwith, we have 23 members going.
4. Michele ask the members to think about when they wanted to have the April Holifield circuit teacher class, on a weekend or during the week & suggest some dates. A discussion was had but no decision was made.

New Business:

1. Bonnie started collecting dues for the rest of this year which is \$7.50. She also is having everyone check their information on file to see if there are any changes to be made instead of having to fill out a whole new info form.
2. New officers will be elected in November and sworn in at the December meeting or party.
3. Kathy discussed possibly changing the time of our meetings to earlier than 6:30 p.m., especially in wintertime when it gets dark earlier. A discussion was had, but no decision was made.
4. It was decided to start having Sit n' Sew in September, 7 people are interested.

Michele, who is also a member of Magnolia Quilters of Orange Grove, informed our group Mary Kate Platts, a member of Magnolia Quilt Guild, will be doing a bed turning for their August project night & invited all Bay Oaks members to come to the bed turning. The turning will be held at Coast Sew n' Vac in Orange Grove starting at 5p.m. Mary Kate has made many beautiful quilts and won many ribbons this will be a great bed turning.
6. Martha discussed what we will need to do to complete all the favors & door prizes needed for the October GSQA meeting which is being cohosted by Bay Oaks & Magnolia quilters. Also if people have any Halloween quilts they would want to hang at the meeting let Martha know.
7. Michele handed out instructions for the Celtic Applique project for July project night.
8. Gloria discussed the class she will be teaching on August 14 at the Kiln library.
9. Martha showed the block for August, which is a sailboat in Red, white, & blue colors. She also suggested you put your name on the sailboat. The pattern will be in the July minutes.
10. Our August project will be an apron using old jeans, taught by Martha.

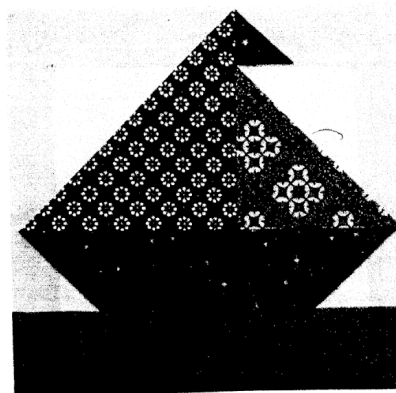
Charlotte made a motion to adjourn the meeting and it was seconded by Barbara. The meeting was then adjourned by Kathy.

Sailboat

Makes 12 ½" block

RED, WHITE & BLUE



Complete all sections before assembling block.

WATER; Cut 3 & ¼" x 12 & ½" strip for water.

BOAT; Cut 3" x 12 & ½" for boat. From background fabric, cut (2) 3" squares. Sew 1 square on each end of boat fabric at 45' angle. Trim.

LARGE SAIL; Cut 8 & ¼" square of background fabric and 8 & ¼" square of sail fabric. Place right sides together. Draw diagonal line. Sew seam ¼" on both sides of diagonal line. Cut on line. You now have (2) ½ square triangles. You only need 1. Trim to 7 & ½" square

SMALL SAIL; Cut 6 & ¼" square of background fabric and 6 & ¼" of sail fabric. Place right sides together. Draw diagonal line. Sew seam ¼" on both sides of diagonal line. Cut on line. You now have (2) ½ square triangles. You only need 1. Trim to 5 & ½" square.

SMALL FLAG STRIP; Cut 2 & 1/2" strip of background fabric. Cut 2 & 1/2" square of sail fabric. Sew square at one end of strip at 45' angle. Trim.

ASSEMBLY; (1) Sew flag strip to top of small sail. (2) Sew sails together. (3) Sew sails to boat strip. (4) Sew water strip to bottom of boat strip. Trim.

Note: I used a blue background and white for the small sail. I didn't think it had enough white so I added a strip of white on top of the boat. I had 2 & ½" x 12 & ½" boat fabric and 1" x 12 & ½" of white to make a 3" x 12 & ½" boat strip before I added the squares on the ends.
