- Cut six (6) coordinated fabrics to block size 11" and stack. Fabrics: Think small prints, bright colors, different values.
- Iron pre-printed freezer paper to the top fabric square.
- Cut through all six fabrics around the edge of the pattern and dark outer lines. Then cut pieces in numerical order as noted on pattern.
- Shuffle fabrics in each lettered section. (ex. Move top fabric on "A" pile and to bottom of "A" pile. Then move 2 fabrics from top of "B" pile to bottom, then 3 from "C" and so on.) Each block will have one piece of each fabric in the completed block.
- Sew pieces together in <u>alphabetical order</u>, one block at a time, with ¼ inch seam. Press each seam away from the last pressed seam.
- There will be some minor trimming to keep edges straight (on C and some dog ears on triangles).
- Square up completed block. Pattern says 6 ½ " (6" finished block), but with minimal trimming you can get a 7" (6 ½ finished block).
