September Business Meeting

The September Business Meeting was held on Thursday, September 11, 2025, at 1:00 pm at the Kiln Library with 17 members present, including one new member.

2026-2027 Board Election Process

The Guild needs to elect a member for the Board Secretary position. The Guild also needs a volunteer to be the Chairperson of the 2027 Quilt Show. All other positions are filled for 2026. Thank you to all who volunteered to be on the 2026 Board and appointed positions.

Changing the Guild's By-Laws

Florence led a discussion on changing the By-Laws to allow staggered 2-year terms so that the Guild would not need a whole new Board every year. This was prompted by a letter sent to the Board by Marsha R.

In order to change the ByLaws:

- 1. The Guild must get the proposed changes in writing - Marsha's letter to the Board fulfills this requirement.
- 2. The Board must propose the changes at the next Business Meeting, which was done at the September 11, 2025, Meeting, and via the Newsletter one month prior to a final vote, which is this Newsletter. The next two requirements are fulfilled. Marsha's letter was also e-mailed to members to read.

Discussions will be held at the October Business A final vote may be held after the discussions. To be approved the change(s) must be passed by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members present.

Charity Donation Chairperson

Louise H, as the Charity Donation Chairperson for our Guild, has volunteered to stay on in her position for 2026. Thank you, Louise!

Louise set up Sew Day at the Kiln Library for October 4, 2025, from 9 am to 2 pm to work on fidget quilts for schools, kennel pads for the Friends of the Animal Shelter, and burrito pillowcases. Members should bring their tools for cutting and ironing, sewing machines, other notions and materials to work on the donation projects.

Kennel pads should be washable, measuring 24 inches by 24 inches or 24 inches by 48 inches for the cages.

The Kiln library has a support group that meets at the library and asks if the Guild could donate 4 fidget quilts to them. The rest of the fidget quilts will go to Hancock Elementary School. Members helped Louise finish many fidget quilts at the Beckwith Retreat. Thank you for the help!!




Donated Fidget Quilts to the Kiln Library

Louise and the Guild Board want to donate quilts for children that CASA on the Coast supports. CASA needs quilts made in children appropriate sizes.

Members can make quilts to donate to the hurricane relief in North Carolina. The Guild purchased batting for these quilts. They can be throw size or larger and there is no deadline for turning them in. Each quilt will need a Bay Oaks Quilt Guild label. There are two different places we can send them: 5 Little Monkeys Quilt & Sew in Weaverville, NC, and Sharon B has contact information through an organization: Rice and Beans.

Sharon B previously mentioned that a good project would be to make pillowcases for residents of Dunbar Village possibly for Christmas. Sharon found out that Dunbar Village has 60 residents at maximum. Two-thirds are women and one-third are men.

Sharon B arranged with the Kiln Librarians to pick a place to hang The Log Cabin Award given to the Guild for donated quilts for North Carolina from Chris Cumbest and his wife Sheila who work with Rice and Beans.







Squaring Up the Inside Block
