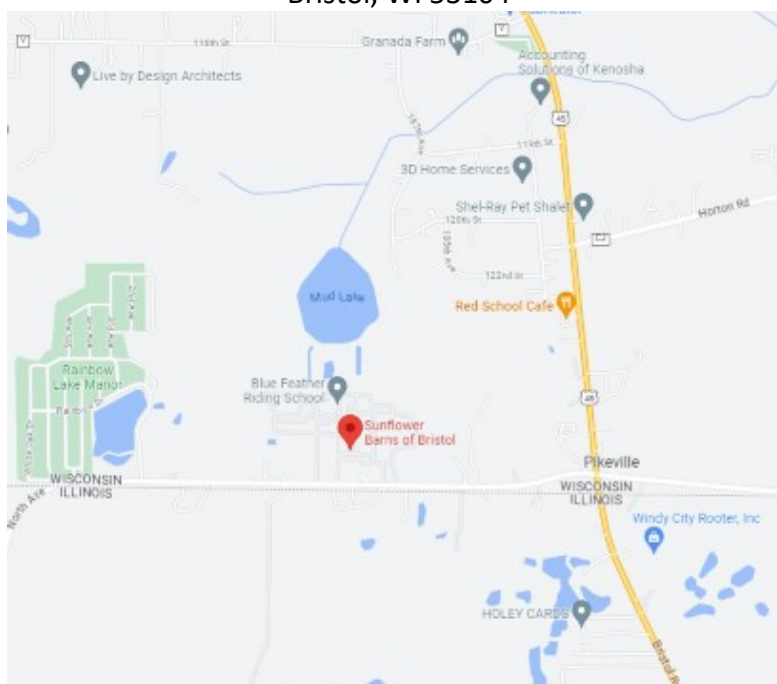

Entry Instructions

If entries are not complete, a \$25 Incomplete Entry Fee will be applied.

Online entries available at www.noteworthyshows.com.

1. All owners, trainers, and exhibitors participating in Arabian/Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian classes must have **AHA Competition membership cards**. Alternatively, an entry may pay \$35 per person AHA Single Event Membership (SEM) fee. (Exempt for Walk/Trot entries, Leadline riders, and those not competing in AHA recognized classes. All breed Traditional classes require **USDF PM or GM membership**).
2. All owners, trainers, and handlers are required to be members of USEF and to be up to date on Safesport training or pay \$45 per person USEF show pass fee.
3. Copies of **USEF membership cards** for each owner, trainer, driver, rider, handler, and agent or trainer or pay \$45 per person USEF show pass fee.
4. WDAA membership is required for all western dressage classes.
5. Entry Form must be complete with Owner/Trainer/Rider information and must contain 3 signatures on the back. An adult signature is required for all Youth exhibitors. Waiver & Release Liability Form **MUST** be signed and included.
6. All entries must include a **signed check** made payable to WAHA covering all fees. Checks may not be blank or postdated. Entries received without **full** payment of all fees will be considered **post-entries**.
7. Dressage riders: Dressage/SHIH classes may not run by class number order or by day due to scheduling. Management has the right to limit Dressage Rides and SHIH Go's. Both are offered on a first come/first served basis. Some SHIH classes may be scheduled on Sunday if a second session is warranted, based on number of entries received.

GENERAL INFORMATION

This horse show is conducted in accordance with the Rules of the USEF and Arabian Horse Association. The official rulebook of each organization will prevail for this show. Each participant in this show is responsible for knowledge of these rules and is subject to these rules. Any changes or corrections of the rules will automatically become part of this prize list. Questions that may arise that are not covered by either AHA or USEF rulebooks will be decided by the Show Committee and their decisions will be final.

1. **USEF Membership:** Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular



Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

2. **USEF Show Pass Fee:** Effective 12-1-2022 any rider, handler, driver, or owner are limited to one Show Pass purchase annually (December 1-November 30). USEF Show Pass will be available for purchase by exhibitors on-line only. Individuals, including parents who are signing as a trainer on behalf of a minor, who are participating as a trainer or coach are not eligible for a Show Pass and must obtain a Senior Competing membership to participate in a USEF licensed competition.
3. **USEF Rules:** Every class offered herein, which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. See USEF Rule Book for Arabian Horse rules, class descriptions and judging specifications. Any changes in the USEF rules will automatically become part of this Prize list. The Show Committee reserves the right to make such changes in procedure, personnel, rules and regulations as deemed by them to be in the best interest of the show.
4. **AHA Membership Statement:** Each competitor (this includes at least one recorded owner and all trainers, drivers, riders, halter handlers, coaches and the person(s) signing the entry blank) in an Arabian Horse Association recognized Arabian division, at the time of entry into a competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA membership/competition card, join AHA, or pay an AHA Single Event Membership Fee per competitor. When an agent signs for the owner at an AHA recognized competition, both the owner and the agent must be members of AHA or pay the AHA Single Event Membership fee. Single Event Membership is not acceptable at AHA regional or national competitions. Exhibitors in walk-trot classes are exempt from AHA membership requirements at qualifying competitions, but must have an AHA membership with competition card at AHA regional and national competitions. Exhibitors in lead line classes or parents/guardians signing for minors are exempt from AHA membership requirements. (BOD 5/12).
5. **USEF Horse Recording/ID:** In order to compete in USEF licensed competitions, every horse must have a unique USEF Horse ID number. Horses must be actively recorded (annual or life) in order to:
 - a. To be eligible for USEF Awards and Championship programs (GR1111).
 - b. To be eligible to compete in a USEF Computer Ranking List class (GR1102.2).
 - c. To be eligible to compete in USEF/USDF qualifying championship classes and USEF National Championships for Dressage (DR127).
 - d. To Acquire an FEI Passport or National Passport and FEI Registration Number (GR1103-1104).
6. **Numbers:** All competitors must complete check-in at the show office and receive a show number, before schooling or riding on the show grounds. Failure to check in at the show office prior to schooling will result in the issuance of a Warning Card. Competition-assigned numbers, or the same number in a personal numbering format, must be worn



and visible at all times when a horse is being hand-walked, exercised or ridden, under penalty of elimination.

7. **Physical Inspection:** Any horse who exhibits questionable symptoms must be immediately removed from the show grounds. Examination or treatment not requested by show officials shall be on a private practice basis.
8. **Liability:** All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Wisconsin Arabian Horse Association, Region 10, and/or Sunflower Barns of Bristol will not be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any horse exhibited or any kind of article. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any person, animal, or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the WAHA Board against any and all loss, including damages and liability thus occasioned, including but not limited to any and all legal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of an entry form to the Show Secretary shall constitute an acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.
9. **Attendants/Grooms/Headers:** No person will be permitted to enter the ring except participants in the class, judges, their assistants, and show officials. Attendants, grooms, and/or headers may enter the ring only when summoned by order of the judge. Headers will be permitted in all driving classes.
10. **Warm-Up Facilities & Competition Arenas:** Indoor Arena: 100' x 220' cover-all with sand footing. Outdoor arena: 200' x 250' with sand footing. The show arena may be switched from the outdoor arena to the indoor arena in case of inclement weather.
11. **Stalls:** Regular stalls: Shed row, 10' x 10' with open gate doors. May not be suitable for stallions or young horses. Premium Indoor Stalls: 12' x 13' or larger (depending on stall), with full sliding doors. Tack stalls may be limited at the discretion of show management. Each horse must be assigned a separate stall (except mares with suckling foals). Stalls will be available by noon on Friday. Early arrival is not permitted. Showing from a trailer is not permitted.
12. **Smoking:** Smoking in the barns is not permitted. This will be strictly enforced.
13. **Bedding and Hay:** Bedding will be available for sale at the show for \$12/bag. No grain, pellets, or hay will be for sale.
14. **Stall Assignments:** Stalls are limited. Therefore, stall assignments will be made on a first come, first served basis based on the following:
 - a. Show patrons
 - b. Class sponsors paid/US government postmarked before entry closing date.
 - c. Stalls paid in order of US government postmark date. Paid stall orders with the same postmark date will be assigned in inverse order to the number of PAID stalls per order whenever possible. Show Management may exercise discretion in regard to stabling placement. Metered postmarks are not acceptable.Note: Premium stall assignments may be dependent on stalls available at the time and group sizes.
15. **Stallions:** No rider under the age of fourteen is permitted to ride a three-year old colt, or stallion of any age, in any under saddle class including Dressage Sport Horse Prospect Under Saddle, Materiale and Suitability classes.
16. **Class Size:** The show committee reserves the right to split or combine any class with duplicate awards presented.
17. **Call for Classes:** The two-minute rule will be strictly enforced. If time is needed for a tack



change, the gate must be notified. All tack changes must be made at the ring entrance.

- 18. PA System:** Due to possible unforeseen problems with any mechanical device, the PA system and class calls over that system are considered a courtesy. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have his horse at the gate at the prescribed time. While every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system, no protest will be upheld nor will any section be changed on the basis of a PA system problem.
- 19. Overnight Camping:** A limited number of electric hookups are available on a first-come, first served basis. Contact show management to reserve.
- 20. No Shows:** There will be a \$5 penalty assessed for "no shows." If you have entered a class and are not going to show in that class, you must notify the Show Office and gate before that class enters the ring or pay a \$5 penalty/class. There will be NO REFUND for No Shows.
- 21. Open Checks:** No "open" checks will be accepted for pre-entry fees or stall reservations. All pre-entries and stall reservations must be accompanied by fully completed, negotiable checks dated on or before the close of entries date. Entries received without such checks will be returned.
- 22. NSF Check Policy:** There is a \$50 penalty for each check returned due to non-sufficient funds. In addition, either of the following may result in termination of personal and/or business check privileges in payment for any charges to WAHA shows or to WAHA for any other charges (including but not limited to dues and/or fees for WAHA programs).
- 23. Entry Refusal:** The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries of any exhibitor at their discretion as stated in the current USEF Rule Book.
- 24. Hoof Length, Shoes, and Pads:** Management reserves the right to request measurement of toe length, shoe dimensions, and remove shoes and/or pads for hoof inspection of any and all horses in any class. Shoes may be pulled and inspected at random.
- 25. Dressage Dress & Equipment Rules:** When cross-entry by rider or horse/rider combination is permitted between Dressage and other Arabian classes at a competition, DR 120 and DR 121 apply only to the designated Dressage warm-up and competition arenas, or when an exhibitor is actually warming-up for Dressage class(es).
- 26. Protective Headgear:** Any rider may wear protective headgear in any division or class without penalty from the judge. Dressage attire requires the use of an ASTM certified helmet. USEF strongly encourages all riders to wear protective headgear. It is the responsibility of the rider, parent, guardian, or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see that the headgear worn complies with safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition. Refer to current USEF Rule Book
- 27. First Aid:** First Aid treatment will be available during all performances for the duration of the horse show in accordance with USEF Rules
- 28. Sharps Containers:** Refer to USEF GR1210. As per USEF rule GR1210.4, all used needles and other disposable sharp instruments must be placed in sharps containers. Per rule GR 1210.4, competition management will fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors and their agents \$100.00 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments
- 29. Printing Errors:** The Show Committee is not responsible for errors in printing. Corrections of any error will be posted in the Show Office.
- 30. Refunds:** Stall fees and office fees will not be refunded under any circumstance. Entry fees for entries cancelled before the official closing date for pre-entries will be returned. Refunds of entry fees will be made after the closing date for pre-entries upon presentation of a Veterinarian's Certificate to the Show Secretary by the end of the last of the class of the show. No refunds will be made thereafter.



- 31. Show Tabs:** Show tabs will not be accepted for pre-entries or stalls. Exhibitors wishing to start a tab for post entries must leave a signed check. Exhibitors understand that these checks will be completed by the Show Secretary for the amount of the tab unless exhibitor closes out the account prior to the close of the show. There will be a \$50 charge per check for checks returned by the bank. Interest of 1 ½ % per month will be assessed on all outstanding accounts. Returned checks not paid within 2 weeks after being notified will be turned over to USEF.
- 32. Discipline:** Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials of this show on the part of the owner, lessee, trainer, groom, rider, driver or handler will disqualify the horse from adjudication. Show Management reserves the right to remove any of the above listed from the show without being liable for compensation or damages (GR 702). Any action(s) against a horse by an exhibitor which are deemed excessive by a judge, federation steward, technical delegate or show veterinarian, in the competition ring or anywhere on the competition grounds may be punished by official warning, elimination, or other sanctions which may be deemed appropriate by the Show Committee. GR702 & GR703
- 33. Judges:** The Show Committee reserves the right to substitute a Judge for the one who is officially designated in the Prize List, according to USEF Rules. No contact shall be made with the Judges during the period of the show unless accompanied by a member of the Show Committee. Further, no exhibitor shall approach a Judge regarding a decision unless he/she first obtains permission from the Steward, who shall arrange an appointment with the Judge at a proper time and place.
- 34. Safe Sport Statement:** Effective immediately, any competition with the start date of September 1, 2020 and later will be required to include the following Safe Sport statement in the Rules and Regulation section of the prize list: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at <http://www.usef.org>
- 35. Indemnity and Non-Responsibility Clause:** All entries are accepted with the understanding that Wisconsin Arabian Horse Association., the Arabian Horse Association, and Sieberts Farms of Bristol and/or their agents will not be responsible for any loss, personal injury, or damage to people, animals, or property. "UNDER THE EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT, EACH PARTICIPANT WHO ENGAGES IN AN EQUINE ACTIVITY EXPRESSLY ASSUMES THE RISK OF ENGAGING IN AND LEGAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR INJURY, LOSS OR DAMAGE TO PERSON OR PROPERTY RESULTING FROM THE RISK OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES."
- 36. Motorized Vehicle Statement:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals



with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

37. TBAs: Ten TBA classes will be offered at this show, but are restricted to dressage, western dressage, sport horse under saddle, or sport horse in hand classes.

38. Health Papers/Coggins Test: An official health certificate issued within 30 days of the show by a licensed veterinarian must accompany all horses not residing in the State of Wisconsin. A negative Coggins certificate issued within the current calendar year must accompany all horses. The health and original Coggins certificates must be available for inspection at the time of check in.

USEF GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule

1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15.

AHA ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND INDEMNIFICATION

This document waives very important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

In consideration for AHA permitting me to participate in this Competition, and by signing the entry blank, I agree as follows:

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in this Competition, as a rider, driver, handler, leasee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, junior exhibitor, or as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. **I AM FULLY AWARE AND ACKNOWLEDGE THAT HORSE SPORTS AND PARTICIPATION IN THIS COMPETITION INVOLVE SERIOUS RISK OF HARM INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, RISKS OF ACCIDENT, SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, BROKEN BONES, HEAD INJURIES, TRAUMA, PAIN AND SUFFERING, AND PROPERTY DAMAGE. I ASSUME ALL RISKS OF HARM TO ME, MY HORSE OR MY PROPERTY.**

I AGREE as a Horse Show Participant (or Parent/Guardian of Participant if a minor) to waive all claims which may otherwise arise from, including but not limited to infectious bacteria, viruses, fungi/mold, parasites or other agents which may be present at the Horse Show (and most other outdoor locations) and can cause infection in humans, as well as in animals.

I AGREE for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns to release AHA, the Competition, the facilities leased by the Competition and the owner(s) of the facilities, and all of their respective officers, officials, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers, affiliated organizations and insurers (collectively, the "Released Parties") from any and all claims for damage, loss, or injury to myself, other persons, horses or other property belonging to me to the fullest extent permitted by law that arises out of or relates in any way to the Competition and my participation in the Competition **INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DAMAGES, LOSS, OR INJURY RESULTING FROM ANY ACTS, FAILURE TO ACT, NEGLIGENCE OR NEGLECT OF OTHER ENTRANTS, THE RELEASED PARTIES, THEIR CONTRACTORS OR INVITEES**, as well as for theft, vandalism, fire, other casualty damage, or damage arising out of any defects in the premises.

I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

I FUTHER AGREE that by participating in an Amateur class that I am in compliance with the USEF Amateur rule.

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. To be eligible to participate and/or compete as an exhibitor, owner, lessee, agent, coach, or trainer in any Federation-Licensed Western Dressage class or competition, persons must be active members of WDAA or pay a non-member fee equal to the price of an annual membership for each competition. Exception: WDAA membership or non-member fee is not required at a Lite Licensed competition. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner need be a member or pay a non-member fee. The competition is responsible for listing either the active member or the owner that paid the non-member fee in the results. The competitions will be responsible for forwarding a list of the names of individuals who pay non-member fees at the competition to WDAA with the post competition report. Payment of non-member fees for the purpose of competing does not entitle the individual to any privileges of the WDAA membership.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will

NOT be counted towards Adequan/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

POINT SYSTEM

The point system is open to all WAHA membership categories. Show at rated and non-rated shows and accumulate points for awards in 19 different categories, several of which are divided by age of horse and/or rider. WAHA recently added a free volunteer category. Volunteer and win prizes! WAHA shows are eligible for DOUBLE POINTS! The points program also recognizes trail riding and endurance. WAHA also hosts horse and rider achievement awards:

LEGION OF MERIT

The Legion of Merit is open to all WAHA membership categories and purebred Arabian, Half-Arabian, and Anglo-Arabians may be nominated for this program. While showing, riding endurance, or trail riding, points are accumulated over the career of the horse. The WAHA Legion of Merit is a separate cumulative WAHA Legion of Merit and is rewarded with a beautiful bronze trophy that is a design unique to WAHA. It is \$50 for the first year or \$40 for each following year to nominate a horse into this program. If choosing the WAHA Points program flat rate program, the LOM program is included.

SUPREME LEGION OF MERIT

The Supreme Legion of Merit is open to Purebreds, Half-Arabians and Anglo Arabians. Horses that have earned the WAHA Legion of Merit may continue in the WAHA Point System. Starting in 2004, horses earning 1,000 additional points in the WAHA system will receive an award for WAHA Supreme Legion of Merit Award. Nomination fee will be \$50 the first year and \$40 for each year thereafter. All rules are the same for the WAHA Supreme Legion of Merit as the WAHA Legion of Merit Award.
