BACK TO SCHOOL IN JAMUL -WHAT IT WAS LIKE BACK WHEN?

Our History - Schools in Jamul By George Merz

The first school in Jamul was held under an oak tree located North of where the AM-PM Station is now. My great Grandfather, William D. Ferguson, arrived in Jamul with his wife and five children in the spring of 1884. His children attending school were William G., Clarence, Charles, Nellie and Mollie.

By 1886 the community realized there was a need for a school/community building - and when built, was a one-room building with two small anterooms, two outhouses and a stable for the horses and burrows that were ridden to school - all built on land donated by my Great Grandfather at the intersection of Proctor Valley Rd. and Maxfield Dr.

The construction/labor was donated by community members and materials were purchased with money obtained from the sale of the "school section".

What is a "school section"? There are 36 sections in a Township. Each section contains 640 acres. During the time of the "Homestead Act" U.S. citizens could file a claim for 160 acres of Federal land. It took five years to obtain title and included requirements such as building a house, fencing and farming the property. In each Township one Section was designated a "School Section" and could only be sold. The money was used for construction of a school/ community building in the township - the School Section for Jamul was South of Echo Vallev.

Grades 1 - 9 were offered.

After graduation, if a student wanted to continue their education, San Diego High School was the only one in the County. Some of the students rode bicycles to high school, others stayed in San Diego during the week, but for many

their schooling ended with their graduation from the local Jamul school. My father Louis Merz attended the Jamul School, completing the 8th grade in 1901.

During the continuing years, the school building functioned as a true community center with school graduations, dances on Saturday night, church services on Sunday, weddings, funerals, farm bureau meetings, traveling entertainment, etc. As a boy I heard many stories about these activities from my great uncles: Clarence, Charlie and William Ferguson. Unfortunately, I can't recall most of them but I remember they delighted in telling me about the tricks they pulled on young ladies that came to Jamul as teachers.

As in most western communities the population in Jamul decreased after the "Homesteading " days. The successful farmers and ranchers acquired the land from the unsuccessful farms. This in turn caused a decrease in the student population. By 1931, when I started the 1st grade, the enrollment had decreased from 30-50 students in the 1888's to five in 1931. For the teacher to keep her job, which was quite important during the depression, there had to be a least six students enrolled. Our teacher went out and recruited three local Indian boys, the Rosales brothers, to come to school so the school could remain open.

Our teacher's maiden name was Clara Maxfield, her father owned the Maxfield Store which was part of the building we knew as the "Branding Iron" (at Campo Road Hwy 94 and Maxfield Drive). We were very fortunate to have her for a teacher. She was a classmate of my great uncles and was hired by the United States Government to teach English in the Philippines after the Spanish-American War. She spent 12 years in the Philippines before returning to the United States and finally Jamul. She was proficient in the English, Spanish and Indian languages. However, she never allowed anything but English to be spoken on the school grounds.

UPDATE ON COTTONWOOD SAND MINE PROJECT

On Tuesday, September 10, 2025 at 9:00am, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors will vote on a decision that could deeply impact our families, homes, health, and future. That meeting will be the final time to voice your opposition to the proposal to grant the Cottonwood Golf Club a major use permit (MUP) to operate an industrial open-pit sand mine for a minimum of 10 years.





PEAK FIRE SEASON BEGINS WITH BACK-TO-BACK FIRES

JULY 9 ~2 PM The Steele Fire broke out above Steele Canyon HS and Steele Cyn Rd. Ground units and aircraft responded quickly. Nearby residents were given both Evacuation Warnings (be ready) and Orders (evacuate now). There was no damage to homes. CalFire is still investigating the cause. 28 acres burned. All residents were cleared to return by the following morning.

JULY 10 ~ 6 PM. The Springa Fire was originally three separate fires along the roadside near Four Corners. CalFire has since determined the cause was a failed catalytic converter. CalFire responded quickly with ground units. Aircraft arrived shortly, and laid retardant along Lyons Valley Rd. and Skyline TT until they had to stop flying due to darkness. Ground units remained throughout the night, the fire was contained and did not jump the roads. Residents were evacuated; no homes were damaged. Honey Springs, Lyons Vly, and Skyline TT were closed the following two days due to mop up work. All Evacuation Alerts were lifted by 9:00 AM July 12.

WILL YOUR NEIGHBORS BE ABLE TO EVACUATE?

Our ONLY county-maintained roads are Honey Springs, Elena Lane*, and the paved part of Deerhorn Valley Rd. All other roads in DV are private easements. Every homeowner is responsible for road maintenance and clearing vegetation along their roadsides to the middle of the road. We have very few escape routes for safe evacuation. Make sure you have cleared your weeds and vegetation so neighbors can evacuate safely.

*Elena Lane was the original Deerhorn Valley Rd and is still county-maintained.

THOUSANDS OF CALIFORNIANS OPPOSE ASSEMBLY BILL 84

SACRAMENTO, CA - Standing on the steps of the State Capitol in July Senate Minority Leader Brian Jones (R-San Diego) joined a group of legislators, parents, and education advocates to speak out against Assembly Bill 84 ahead of its hearing in the Senate Education Committee.

"This is the number one bill my office has heard about from constituents this year, and their message is clear: Californians don't want it," said Leader Jones. "At its core, AB 84 hands more control to the state and union bosses while tying the hands of parents. Families want more choice, not more bureaucracy. I urge the Senate Education Committee to do the right thing today and vote NO on AB 84."

AB 84 would strip over \$1 billion from California classrooms, bury charter schools and homeschool programs in red tape, and limit flexible, student-centered learning options that thousands of families depend on, including low-income students and students with special needs.

Growing bipartisan opposition to the bill reflects broad concern that AB 84 would undermine educational freedom and hurt the very students the Legislature should be helping.

Jamul Memories by Dave Beekman

Dave's Plumbing Tip of the Month... The care and feeding of your Septic System

One thing all "Jamulians" have in common: We are all on 'Septic'... We don't call the City or the County water dept when we have a problem. We are responsible for our own waste water treatment.. City folks moving out here (like me 40 years ago) eventually have to deal with that 'dreaded fact' especially if something goes wrong. For years, for some... nothing goes wrong until: " What's that SMELL?"

"That Smell" and the significant cost to get rid of it, can be avoided however, by good waste water management practices starting when you move into your new Jamul dream home or buy someone else's. Good waste water management begins with knowing something about how your septic system works.... No motors.. No pumps... Just gravity and the magic of Biology. Your septic system is really a "Biological marvel." in that it uses naturally occurring organisms to digest whatever you put down there into 'pure' water that runs off into your Leach Field to recharge the natural water table (aquifer) and non digestible solids that remain in your Septic Tank.

Your "Leach Field" consists of 200' - 300' of perforated PVC pipe buried in sand and gravel 2' - 3' below the ground in your yard. Your leach field is approximate 50 x 50' hopefully downhill from your dream home. You may notice the weeds and grass grow greener than in other parts of your yard due to the continuous supply of water. Your Septic Tank is a 1,000+ gallon two compartment precast concrete or plastic device buried in your yard hopefully below the level of your dream home.

When you take a shower or flush a toilet, your waste water plumbing directs the flow out to the first compartment of your septic tank where 'digestion' begins. an overflow allows 'purified' water to flow to the second tank that is connected to your leach field described above. Now that you know how your system works, you can appreciate how to keep it 'healthy' and trouble free.

The following are some tips on keeping your system running for years and avoiding... "What's That Smell."

Most important.... Be Careful What you Put Down There!

- Bleach and harsh cleansers 'kill' the natural bacteria that are trying to digest the solids in your waste water...
 Use environmentally responsible cleaning products.
- 2. Install an additional waste water standpipe and P Trap at your clothes washer directed outside to water your yard plants and trees. (\$12 at your hardware store) Plants love the Phosphates in soapy water.. Your Septic System doesn't.
- 3. Get rid of your Garbage Disposer... and get some Chickens...:)
 80% of the solids that go into your Septic System is trying to digest come from food waste.
- 4. Have your septic System Professionally Pumped out every year or so to keep undigested solids from clogging your leach lines. Digging up and re-doing your Leach Field could cost \$thousand\$...

That's my story and I'm stickn' to it ..




