



#### DEERHORN VALLEY ANTLER NEWS

#### WILDFIRE SEASON BEGINS IN EARNEST-DO YOU KNOW HOW TO STAY INFORMED? Here's a recap of some local information sites.

During Wildfire Season it's more important than ever to stay connected. When fire threatens, there is often little time to make informed decisions about your safety. Deerhorn Valley was the community hardest hit in the 2007 Harris Fire. The evacuated residents had little information to go on. As the days wore on, heavy smoke and the remote location limited the media from reporting on Deerhorn Valley. Day after day after day we all waited- not knowing if our homes still stood or our animals had survived.

Our volunteer firefighters had been called to the first reports of the fire in Potrero; there they remained and could not report out, phone lines were burned, cell towers were down, power was out. It would be more than a week before residents [with ID] were allowed back in to see what had survived. In all nearly half of Deerhorn was gone. We needed a better way to share info.

#### WELCOME TO DEERHORN VALLEY

Nestled between Lyons Peak and Mount Elena in the San Diego fo

DEERHORNVALLEY.NET rose amid the ashes. We were 2-3 months without phone service, but power ---and internet--- was available within a week of returning. Via the website folks could share information from the Recovery Centers at the Deerhorn Fire Station and in Dulzura. It was the first step to creating a local network of sites for sharing information.



ANTLER ALERTS SOON FOLLOWED— These email notices went out to subscribers about wildfire, road conditions, traffic, crashes, and other emergencies. In between emergencies, the emails became "ANTLER UPDATES" and covered community news and events. This kept the system fresh and "working" for the most critical times. The signup link is posted on the website.

Not everyone even had an email then, but it was a start. Today there are nearly 500 Antler Alert subscribers and the signup link is on DeerhornValley.net.

THE DEERHORN FACEBOOK EXCHANGE was Deerhorn's first

social media page. It was created as a "Closed Page," and intended just for residents past and present-a way to create a safer online site for those apprehensive or fearful about what the often "free-for-all" nature of social media. Rules for respect and content were meant to try and ensure

resident members felt "safe" online. Here items were bartered, information shared, and local recommendations made for and trades. Today it remains "By and For" Deerhorn residents.



DEERHORN VALLEY COMMUNITY FACEBOOK was set up as a public Facebook page for information and announcements. Notices posted here can be accessed by anyone, and shared with The Exchange, via Antler Alerts, and DeerhornValley.net

These local information sources are just an addition to the official ones. While not as complete, or even accurate as official releases, they usually are much quicker to get info out. The Facebook pages have proven to be very effective, and there several other "Jamul" pages to bookmark. Just put "Jamul" in the Facebook Search Box.

BROADCASTIFY.COM lets you listen free to



east county radio traffic via Heartland Fire and Rural-CalFire-USFS. When wildfire threatens, anyone can listen in to radio communications with a computer, tablet, or smartphone. This can be an invaluable info source even if you don't have a multi-band radio or scanner.



#### What's In A Name? By George Merz

I have been requested to devote an issue to the names in the Jamul area - many of the names were the names of the early settlers that moved into Jamul.

For example: **LOCKWOOD & HOLLENBECK** were two families that settled on Rancho Jamul thinking the United States Government would not recognize the Mexican Land Grants. They are characters in the book 'The Squatter and the Don" written about the Jamul Ranch at that time. When the United States Government forced them off Rancho Jamul Hollenbeck filed a homestead for 1160 acres in what is now known as Holenbeck Canyon. The Lockwood's filed a homestead claim on the 160 acres that is now in the middle of Rancho Jamul Estates. Descendents now own the property.

BRATTON VALLEY, settled by the Bratton family in 1860's.

**BARRETT LAKE** named by the Spreckles Sugar Company after purchasing the land from the Baarrett Family that was flooded by Barrett Lake. The Barrett family then bought the land in Jamul now known as the Simpson property including former Simpson's Nursery.

**DEERHORN VALLEY** - named after the abundance of deer in the area. Originally the Walker family owned most of the area. One of the family members furnished venison to the Coronado and U.S. Grant Hotels for many years, until it became illegal to sell wild game.

**LYONS VALLEY - I** have heard two stories, one is the original owner was named Lyons. The other is, when the trash is burned off Lyons Peak, viewing the rocks from a certain direction you can see the outline of a Lion.

**LAWSON VALLEY** - The first owner that I knew was named Steele. I will always remember him because when I started working at the Jamul Service Station in 1938, he was one of the few that would give me a tip for washing his windshield. He was a stock broker and would often be a speaker about business methods and practices at local meetings like the Fire Bureau, etc. He impressed the locals by saying, "Nobody wins in a lawsuit, avoid them if you can".

**HARPER RANCH** - located in the upper end of Hollenbeck Canyon, owned by Harper who was the son-in-law of Cecil B. DeMile, the movie magnate of the 1930's. It was used as a retreat for may of the movie stars at that time. It was also a thrill to recognize them when they would stop at the Jamul Service Station.

**KIMBALLGRADE** - Named after the contractor that built the new Lyons Valley Road from East of the Mormon Church to Lee Valley.

**JAMACHA** - Now known as Rancho San Diego. The school house and community center was between the Ivanhoe Ranch Road and Jamul Drive. It was named for the wild gourds that grew in the area.

**DULZURA -** East of Jamul on SH 94, the Spanish translation is sweetness, gentleness or mildness.

**SAN YSIDRO MOUNTAIN** - The mountain South of Rancho Jamul and just North of the border with Mexico. Recently known as Otay Mountain. Named for the Saint of farms and ranches.

SAN MIGUEL MOUNTAIN - Between Jamul and San Diego named after arc"Angel" Saint Michael. Currently there are many radio and television towers on the top. A gas fired beacon light was installed on top of the mountain at the beginning of the United States Air Mail Service, to help the pilots locate San Diego. Later the original beacon was replaced with an electric beacon that rotated with a red light and a white beam. The beam would cross our porch in Proctor Valley Road every rotation. The beacon was turned off the day after the attack on Pearl Harbor, as far as I know it was never returned to service.

HONEY SPRINGS - Named for the good spring water and the apiaries that were located in the area. Honey was the best "cash" crop for many of the early settlers. Bees did very well due to the abundance of flowers and flowering shrubs located in the area. The Honey Springs Ranch has not been successful in recent years. After World War I an attempt was made to make it into a retreat or sanitorium. Buildings were built with sleeping rooms and a main dining room and activities room. This was not successful and then became a "nude ranch" in the 1930's. Another attempt at success in the late 1930s was to make cheese from the milk from the many goats that grazed on the ranch. In the 1970s was to make cheese from the milk from the many goats that grazed on the ranch. In the 1970s a major attempt was made to develop a ranch into estate type property. A few of the local residents had enough political power to stop the development, after millions of dollars had been spent on planning, engineering, and other requirements imposed by the State of California and the County of San Diego. Eventually, the ranch was purchased by one of the "so-called" Environmental Protection agencies. I try to avoid Honey Springs Road whenever possible because it is so depressing to me to see the ranch in the current condition after remembering the cultivated fields and cattle grazing land.

**PROCTOR VALLEY** - Located at the Southerly end of Proctor Valley Road - named for one of the early settlers in the area. During the 1860s and 1870s this was part of the grazing land for the Geary family. Supposedly they had 3000 head of sheep freeze in the canyons on the West site of Jamul Mountain during the great freeze of 1873.

## CERT REPORT

**County-wide CERT Drill:** Almost half of the SDCFA CERT – So. Division Program members took a leadership role in planning and working the Spring 2018 County-wide CERT Drill. 108 CERT members from 21 CERT Programs in San Diego County tested their skills during the County-wide CERT Drill on May 19, 2018. The Drill was held at the Heartland Fire and Rescue Training Facility in El Cajon.

The teams were run through a series of stations testing their skill level in: Fire Safety, Light Search and Rescue, Leveraging and Cribbing (lifting a heavy object to rescue a trapped victim), and Disaster Medical Operations (Bleeding Control). In addition to presentations from guest speakers from a Fire Search and Rescue Team Captain (Santee Fire) and the Sheriff on the use of drones in Search and Rescue, the participants had to identify hazardous materials placards and work through an Incident Command System refresher course.

This annual Drill is an important assess- ment tool for the CERT Program Managers to identify team strengths and potential areas of growth. 



## REMEMBER THE ALCOHOL BEVERAGE CONTROL "ABC" HEARINGS?

After over 1000 protestants objected to a liquor license being issued to the now defunct Hollywood casino Jamul, the ABC held a hearing, due to the protest, but the Hearing Judge had to recuse himself before giving a decision. He recused himself because tainted internal State emails were sent to various State offices only hours after the hearing had concluded. A second hearing was held months later with a different Hearing Judge. This Judge immediately approved the liquor license without any of the requested restrictions, which were similar restriction to those placed on other Indian casinos in the County. The attorneys for the County and Jamul residents filed an appeal. <u>Now many months later:</u>


