#### 2019 FIRE MITIGATION GRANTS: (YEAR EIGHT of 60-year SDG&E program)

This year virtually every Deerhorn Valley application was approved, and owners received a full grant (up to \$2,327) for either structure hardening or defensible space. This was a welcome change from the past few years for many of us.

Unfortunately the program as originally approved was never implemented. Various changes have been made to it every year. Administrative costs have risen as the Grant Committee made more and more homes "eligible" — but with zero increase in total funding. The Committee failed even to file budgets or expense reports for the first five years (2012-2016) With no oversight during the first years, the grants program morphed into a bureaucracy that added 15,000 homes, the vast majority in non-risk areas (per SDG&E). The Alpine Fire Marshal "worked hard" to make as many homes in his district eligible as he could, even though the underground lines there posed no fire risk. As Deerhorn grants decreased, many residents became discouraged and stopped applying. Yet we are the most populated area directly adjacent and downwind of the Powerlink.

So concerns remain. Residents will continue to monitor how grant dollars (barely enough for 1,000 homes) are being used. We understand that SDG&E purposefully excluded Alpine, etc. from grants, because they lie upwind of the Powerlink or the lines were

undergrounded. Overhead lines not only can start fires, but also interfere with effective air or ground attacks.

#### YEARS 1-5

• In 2012 added 4,000 low-risk homes (eventually 14,000) to the program without justification or public notice. This increased overhead costs and reduced grants to highest-risk areas

- · Made homes built after the Harris Fire ineligible—successfully appealed
- Made Deerhorn mobile homes ineligible (2014)—successfully appealed.
- Filed NO yearly Program Reports from 2012-2016 in violation of EIR and CPUC requirements.

#### YEARS 6—8

- Gave priority to first-time applicants in low-risk areas over most-at-risk
- Labeled numerous homes Deerhorn and Lyons as low priority even though surrounded by Extreme Risk terrain
- Added more low risk homes upwind and outside the Powerlink "fireshed" (where fire is predicted to move) further depleting grant funds.
- Allocated \$203,000 from Homeowner Grant to fund four Open Houses (2018-2019) attended by fewer than 60 people each.
- · Spent tens of thousands in grant funds on urban Alpine, even though Alpine is outside the fireshed, protected with paved roads, easy evacuation routes, and its own Fire Department. Alpine is at lowest risk due to SDG&E undergrounding the lines since the beginning.

Because the Committee failed to notify the public—or CPUC—for five years, they made decisions with no oversight and in violation of the requirements. This depleted grant funds for those at highest risk, and resulted in an inconsistent and arbitrary application process. Find the current Operating Plan at SPFMG.org

In year six (2017) the DVCA and Sup Dianne Jacob filed complaints. Even then, CPUC gave them a pass, and there is still NO public participation in the grant application/review process. The official response to grant denials continues to be "NO APPEALS." Even in the case of obvious errors.

Applications for next year's grant program should be mailed to homeowners in January. Use them or lose them.

Miss out on the Fire Grants this year? If you know anyone who is a senior, disabled, AND lower income, there is help available from the San Diego County FireSafe Council. Details on their website below.

#### Life's Memories in Jamul

By George Merz

September 1938 I started attending Grossmont High School at the age of twelve. The bus picked us up, usually around 7:20am, at what is now Hwy 94 and Jefferson Street. The bus held 44 passengers including the jump seats. Jump seats were boards that were place in the isle between the seats. The driver kept the bus at his home at Barrett overnight. The route was Hwy 94 to Avocado Blvd. Both Grammar School (and high school students) were picked up until we reached Chase Avenue in El Caion. The bus then went on to the El Cajon Grammar School to drop off the Grammar School students, then on to Grossmont High School. Classes were 8:40 am to 3:40 pm. We arrived back in Jamul around 5 pm.

It was very difficult for me to go from a school with the maximum enrollment of 22 to a school with over 600 students. At the Jamul School we did our homework while the teacher was teaching other grades. At Grossmont we had homework in every class. Besides the adjustments, I was competing mostly with fourteen year old students in the 9th grade, while I was only twelve years old. My problems were also compounded because I wanted to take some technical courses like agriculture, auto mechanics, general mechanics, etc. My mother insisted I take college preparatory courses that didn't allow me to take any of the courses I wanted. We were unable to participate in any sports or other after school activities because the school bus was our only means of transportation.

During my freshman, sophomore and junior years, Mr. Larsen was our bus driver. We all liked Mr. Larsen and would never cause him any problems. The girls were always required to sit in the rear of the bus and the boys in the front. During my senior year, we had a new bus driver nobody liked. We would all try to think up things that would make his life miserable. During football season the bus would not leave the school until after the home games. It

would be dark before we left Grossmont High School. He would not let the girls sing any school songs after sundown. I can't remember all the things we did to cause problems, however, one in particular was one of the boys put a potato in the exhaust pipe of the bus at the High School. It ran alright until we started up the hill on Avocado Blvd. The bus quit, so I was sent to a house to call the school and they sent a mechanic. Of course, when the mechanic arrived, the potato had been removed and the bus ran fine. After the mechanic left and while we were returning to our seats, the potato was put back in the exhaust. This time, when I called the high school they sent another bus to take us home.

The bus had an escape door in the rear. If we got "kicked off" the bus for any reason, the girls would huddle around the door so the driver couldn't see, then we would enter and sit on the floor until we reached Jamul. Another time we put tea in empty whiskey bottles and pretended to be drinking it.

I continued to work at the Jamul store and service station during my freshman, sophomore and junior years in high school. During my senior year, I worked for a man that had the property where the Mormon Church is now located. I would ride my bicycle there morning and evenings, milk the cows, and feed the calves and hogs. He paid seventy-five cents per hour on Saturday. The pay was more than double what I earned at the Jamul Store and Service Station.


