Another day and yet again another sad "anniversary". One year ago today, young Hoss lost his life. Another dog under Doggedly's care who died in boarding without ever getting a fair chance at a real life.

Hoss came to A chance to bloom shortly before the eviction of Dogtown. He was one of many dogs that was loaded on a flatbed trailer and hauled off to the local Conroe shelter in December 2019. Barbara pulled Hoss and the all of other a chance to bloom / Dogtown dogs ( with the help of another rescues 501c3 status) from the shelter and assumed responsibility of them under Doggedly dog rescue society right away. Hoss was transported to Katy Dog Suites where he remained until the day he died.

Hoss did get to spend a short amount of time in Barbara's home ("foster care") but ultimately spent most of his life as a "rescued dog" in boarding. First Dogtown then KDS.

Hoss wasn't an old dog and as far as any of us working with Barbara knew, he was healthy, other than being high heartworm positive.

Hoss's care was never prioritized. He was put on the back burner while Barbara committed to so many new dogs, even ones who required much more costly medical treatments. Hoss was also never networked for a foster so that he could undergo Heartworm treatment. It's evident by the photos of the full size adult worms that he vomited before dying, that he needed more than just the monthly Heartworm preventative (slow kill) that he was (allegedly) getting.

Hoss is yet ANOTHER dog who fell victim to the narcissistic and fraudulent ways of a bad rescue. It's hard to not believe that had his health been a priority and he had received the treatment that he needed, that he'd still be alive today.

I had to learn my lesson the hard way and I regret following blindly someone who I thought was going to do the right thing for these dogs. Don't be like me. Don't ignore red flags, don't be complacent. Demand transparency and speak up when you see animals suffering. It's too late for Hoss but there are many other dogs just like Hoss who still deserve a chance to finally be rescued, to finally find a real home. RIP Hoss

If you see fraud and do not say fraud, you are a fraud.


