Cultural Celebrations!

Our holiday focus for the next three weeks will be "celebrations in other cultures." During this time we will be exploring and learning how different cultures celebrate the season and taste foods from around the world. In this way the children can learn about our multi-cultural world, its customs and celebrations instead of focusing on specific celebrations of faith. Your child will be learning about the geography, history, culture, and languages of Thailand and Mexico. If anyone has any interesting artifacts, music or clothing from either of these cultures, we'd love you to share them with us.

Our Annual Multi-cultural celebrations are scheduled for Wednesday, December 18 and Thursday December 19 from 9:00 - 10:30 a.m. Similar to our harvest celebration, the children will circulate around to each room or country/culture, sample foods from that area of the world, create cultural art projects and participate in cultural celebrations. We encourage children to participate by dressing in either traditional Thai or Mexican dress for the celebrations. If your child feels uncomfortable dressing up they can come as they are as several of the activities will allow them to accessorize. We will be celebrating both cultures on Wednesday and Thursday so if your child attends both days they can pick one traditional costume or switch if they would like. We will be eating an Thai lunch on one day and a Mexican lunch on the other. We welcome parents to sign up on the parent bulletin board to participate in all the fun and activities!

- Fisherman pants (baggy pants)

Activities the students will be working on include

- Elephants and other animals of Thailand
- Lotus flower works
- Map and Flag of Thailand

- Brightly colored woven and embroidered textiles such as shirts, skirts, scarves, sashes and ponchos
- Straw hat or sombrero
- Sandals (with socks please ©)

- Aztec and Mayan works

Snow Day Alert System

With winter on its way, it is important for your child to have a **warm coat clearly labeled** with his or her name inside. On snowy days we will only be venturing outside after lunch (12:00-1:00 p.m.).

We ask that your child have the following items (clearly labeled) at school each day: warm waterproof gloves/mittens, a hat, boots, and snowsuit. We also ask parents to bring in a bag (a reusable grocery bag works well) with all your child's winter items and ask them to hang it on their homeroom hook when they arrive at school.
