- Write numerals on construction paper and cut them into squares (or highlight numerals on construction paper, have your child trace the numerals and then have them cut the squares)
- Use refrigerator magnet numerals
- Write numerals on clothespins if you have any lying around.
- Any 1-10 numerals you have from other materials work too!


Your child can choose whatever items they would like to count with. Have a myriad of legos? Dinosaurs? Marbles? Blocks? Any plethora of items you have that are the same or similar you can use to count. Start with 1-3, extend to 1-5, isolate 6-10 if 1-5 is solid.
