Also, we would like to remind parents that sharing begins promptly at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday and Friday mornings. Dear Parents,

Here's a recipe for playdough that is easy to make:

#### PLAYDOUGH

2 Cups Flour 1 Cup Salt 2 Cups Water 4 Tsp Cream of Tartar 2 Tbsp Oil
