# What have the students been up to and what do they have to look forward to this

**month?** This first month of school we have focused greatly on normalization in the classroom. The four characteristics of normalization are: love of work, concentration, self-discipline, and sociability. If you would like to learn more about normalization in the Montessori classroom there are articles on the parent bulletin board (in the kitchen) and you are welcome to take one home!

#### Math and Sensorial Skills

The students have been working on

- Basic shapes: names, number of sides, shape
- Colors and visual matching
- Exploring 1-10 through counting, books, and numeral formation
- Counting and writing 1-20

This month we will be introducing

- Many-sided shapes
- Size discrimination
- Patterns

#### <u>Art</u>

The students have been working on

- Basic skills such as cutting, gluing, how to care for the artistic tools, and clean up procedures
- Primary colors and distinguishing warm vs cool colors

This month we will be introducing

- Learning about line and exploring with different line drawings
- Pastels

#### <u>Practical Life</u>

The students have been working on

- Developing concentration and hand-eye coordination
- Practicing cleaning up after oneself This month we will be introducing
- Harvest/Fall theme work

#### **Spanish**

The students have been working on

- Spanish greetings, colors, numbers, and shapes This month we will be introducing
- Face & Body parts in Spanish

#### Language

The students have been working on

• Language development through initial sound works, and letter formation.

This month we will be introducing

• Lowercase letter formation using the sand-pan, skywriting, letter-pin-punching, vowels, and letter formation books

#### Science and Geography

The students have been working on

- Learning about the universe, galaxies, and our solar system
  - Intro to classification (living/non-living, plant/animal, vertebrate/invertebrate)

This month we will be introducing

• The 5 animal kingdoms. Leaves, Earth's layers, volcanos, fossils, and dinosaurs.

For these reasons we have imposed a No Character or Super-hero clothing rule at Children's House of Durango. Character shoes are excepted as we realize they are often the only school-suitable shoes the child owns. Please help us to promote a peaceful, healthy environment by evaluating whether the image on your child's shirt is appropriate each morning.

Morning Class – Please try to arrive at school on time. Entering a class during lessons can break the concentration of students. We would like to remind parents that morning lesson (or sharing on TH &F) begins promptly at 9:00 a.m.

## Cook's Corner

Dear Parents,

Here's a recipe for my enchiladas that is easy to make:

#### **Enchiladas**

- 1 16oz can pinto beans
- ½ onion
- 2-3 cloves garlic
- 1 can green enchilada sauce (we use Las Palmas)
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 12 6-inch tortillas

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and grease an 11x7 dish. Sauté onions and garlic and add them to a large bowl with the beans and enchilada sauce. Puree until bean mixture has reached a refried bean consistency (If you use dried beans, cook them the night before).

Layer the bottom of your greased baking dish with tortillas. Add a layer of beans, then cover with a layer of cheese. Repeat tortillas, beans, cheese, until your dish is full or you have used all your ingredients. Top your enchiladas with more cheese and bake for 30 minutes or the cheese is melted to your liking.
