Morning Drop-off:

7:30-8:30 everyone will drop off in the kitchen. 8:30-9:00 Blue Room drop offs in the kitchen, Rainbow Room drop offs through the back gate. <u>We ask that one family drops off at a time.</u> If someone is in the kitchen or the back gate please be patient, we do our best to help each student enter school as calm and smoothly as possible.

Afternoon Pickup: Please enter and exit through the back gate so the teachers see you and can help your child gather their items to take home.

Only staff and students are allowed inside the school at this time.

For the safety of the students and the school the front door is locked any time we are all out on the playground.

There is an iPad in the kitchen and in the backyard for signing your child in and out.

Our Annual Open-House will take place on Thursday, September 15th from 5:30-6:30 p.m.

The teachers will be in their classrooms to introduce themselves, demonstrate some of our wonderful Montessori materials, and answer any questions regarding each subject area. This will be an informative evening and we hope to see you there.

School photos will take place on Wednesday and Thursday, September 20th and 21th. Please note, orders are placed online after photos are taken – there are no envelopes sent home.

Birthday Celebrations - On your child's birthday, a special Montessori-influenced celebration takes place after lunch in their homeroom. In this ceremony, the child holds a globe and walks around the "sun" (candle) for each year of his/her life. A special, small, after-lunch treat may be brought in for this occasion. Suggestions include fresh fruit with whipped cream, bite-sized cupcakes, or small cookies.

Reminders:

Sharing – On Thursdays and Fridays at 9:00 a.m. the students have sharing time in their class. The purpose of this time is for our students to practice public speaking and using descriptive words to describe items.

Children may bring something from home fitting into the category for that day and is able to fit in their personal bin for the rest of the day.

Our list of dates and themes is attached in the welcome email, posted in the kitchen, uploaded on both our website and on Shutterfly. We ask that only appropriate items be brought in, <u>no toy</u> weapons please. With the exception of sharing days, toys are not permitted at school. Also please note that sharing takes place during circle time promptly at 9:00am. If your child arrives after circle time he or she will miss sharing for that day.

<u>Snacks</u> – We ask that parents *sign up once a month* to bring in some snack foods for your child's homeroom and afternoon snack (only for students enrolled past 3:00pm). Snacks are added to our stock and these snack items may be served throughout a week. Suggestions include yogurt, cheese, fruit, popcorn, bagels, crackers, etc. Homemade baked breads or muffins are always welcome as long as they do not contain any nut products. Cashews and Pistachios are not allowed in the school.

Each student needs a water bottle to keep in their classroom throughout the school year. We want to ensure that your children are staying hydrated throughout the day, while at the same time encouraging independence. We ask parents to please label your child's bottle and take it home once a week for washing. Please only send water in water bottles.

Late Fees - After the fifth day of the month, Children's House will charge a late fee of 1% of tuition due each day. If tuition is not received by thirty (30) days your child may not attend school until past tuition is paid in full. Non-payment or excessive late payments without prior arrangements may, at the Director's/Owner's discretion, result in canceling the enrollment of the child/children.
